#### A BILL

To amend section 3505.10 of the Revised Code to	1
modify the deadline for a political party to	2
certify its nominees for President and Vice-	3
President to the Secretary of State.	4

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

<b>Section 1.</b> That section 3505.10 of the Revised Code be	5
amended to read as follows:	6
Sec. 3505.10. (A) On the presidential ballot below the	7
stubs at the top of the face of the ballot shall be printed	8
"Official Presidential Ballot" centered between the side edges	9
of the ballot. Below "Official Presidential Ballot" shall be	10
printed a heavy line centered between the side edges of the	11
ballot. Below the line shall be printed "Instruction to Voters"	12
centered between the side edges of the ballot, and below those	13
words shall be printed the following instructions:	14
"(1) To vote for the candidates for president and vice-	15
president whose names are printed below, record your vote in the	16
manner provided next to the names of such candidates. That	17

recording of the vote will be counted as a vote for each of the
candidates for presidential elector whose names have been
certified to the secretary of state and who are members of the
same political party as the nominees for president and vice-
president. A recording of the vote for independent candidates
for president and vice-president shall be counted as a vote for
the presidential electors filed by such candidates with the
secretary of state.

- (2) To vote for candidates for president and vicepresident in the blank space below, record your vote in the
  manner provided and write the names of your choice for president
  and vice-president under the respective headings provided for
  those offices. Such write-in will be counted as a vote for the
  candidates' presidential electors whose names have been properly
  certified to the secretary of state.
- (3) If you tear, soil, deface, or erroneously mark this

  ballot, return it to the precinct election officers or, if you

  cannot return it, notify the precinct election officers, and

  obtain another ballot."

(B)(1) Below those instructions to the voter shall be printed a single vertical column of enclosed rectangular spaces equal in number to the number of presidential candidates plus one additional space for write-in candidates. Each of those rectangular spaces shall be enclosed by a heavy line along each of its four sides, and such spaces shall be separated from each other by one-half inch of open space.

In each of those enclosed rectangular spaces, except the space provided for write-in candidates, shall be printed the 45 names of the candidates for president and vice-president 46 certified to the secretary of state or nominated in one of the 47

vice-president shall not be placed on the ballot, but shall be	113
certified to the secretary of state as required by sections	114

the electors of those candidates whose names have been certified	117

(C) The arrangement of the printing in each of the	119
enclosed rectangular spaces shall be substantially as follows:	120
Near the top and centered within the rectangular space shall be	121
printed "For President" in ten-point boldface upper and lower	122
case type. Below "For President" shall be printed the name of	123
the candidate for president in twelve-point boldface upper case	124
type. Below the name of the candidate for president shall be	125
printed the name of the political party by which that candidate	126
for president was nominated in eight-point lightface upper and	127
lower case type. Below the name of such political party shall be	128
printed "For Vice-President" in ten-point boldface upper and	129
lower case type. Below "For Vice-President" shall be printed the	130
name of the candidate for vice-president in twelve-point	131
boldface upper case type. Below the name of the candidate for	132
vice-president shall be printed the name of the political party	133
by which that candidate for vice-president was nominated in	134

candidates nominated by petition under section 3517.012 of the	136
Revised Code, no political identification or name of any	137
political party shall be printed below the names of presidential	138
and vice-presidential candidates nominated by petition.	139
The rectangular spaces on the ballot described in this	140
section shall be rotated and printed as provided in section	141
3505.03 of the Revised Code.	142
Section 2. That existing section 3505.10 of the Revised	143
Code is hereby repealed.	144
Section 3. The amendments to section 3505.10 of the	145
Revised Code by this act first apply on January 1, 2025.	146
Section 4. (A) Notwithstanding any provision of the	147
Revised Code to the contrary, a major political party shall	148
certify to the Secretary of State in writing the names of its	149
candidates for president and vice-president nominated by its	150
national convention pursuant to section 3505.10 of the Revised	151
Code not later than the seventy-fourth day before the 2024	152
general election. The political party may transmit the	153
certification to the Secretary of State by any reasonably	154
reliable method that, under the circumstances, will provide for	155
the Secretary of State to receive it by the deadline, including	156
by any of the following methods:	157
(1) Hand delivery;	158
(2) Certified, express, or ordinary mail delivery by the	159
United States Postal Service;	160
(3) Commercial carrier service;	161
