## A RESOLUTION

Recognizing Black Music Month, June 2023.

WHEREAS, The members of the Senate of the 135th General Assembly of Ohio are pleased to recognize June 2023 as Black Music Month; and WHEREAS, In 1979, President Jimmy Carter declared June to be Black 3 Music Month, and it has been re-designated annually by presidential 4 proclamation. It has been set aside to commemorate and call attention 5 to the contributions this art form has had on America's treasured 6 cultural heritage; and 7 WHEREAS, Rooted in African rhythms and the experience of slavery in America, Black music became a method of expression, articulating 9 the hopes and dreams, tenacity, sense of loss, and feelings of African 10 Americans. The music has grown and evolved, creating and influencing 11 such genres as spirituals, gospel, folk, jazz, blues, rhythm and 12 blues, rock and roll, soul, pop, rap, and hip-hop, and its messages, 13 often bringing an understanding of the common struggles of humanity, 14 have not only molded American culture but also been emulated around 15 the world; and 16 WHEREAS, Black Music Month offers a time to celebrate the varied 17 songs and artists that challenge us to think critically, stand up to 18 injustice, remember history, promote dignity, instill hope, and 19 inspire creativity. It also provides an opportunity for all Americans 20 to pay homage to the legends of American music and to increase their 21 awareness and appreciation of Black music; therefore be it 22 RESOLVED, That we, the members of the Senate of the 135th General 23 Assembly of Ohio, in adopting this Resolution, recognize June 2023 as 24 Black Music Month and encourage all Ohioans to take part in this 25

noteworthy observance; and be it further
