#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3517.121 of the Revised Code be	4

(b) If the attorney general is a victim or witness or	89
otherwise involved in an alleged violation of this section, the	90
attorney general shall refer the matter to the appropriate	91
prosecutor, as determined under division (A)(2) of section	92
3517.155 of the Revised Code, except that if applicable, the	93
attorney general shall make the determination described in	94
division (A)(2)(b) of that section instead of the Ohio elections	95
commission.	96
(2) Upon the occurrence of either of the following, the	97
attorney general shall investigate an alleged violation of this	98
section in consultation with the secretary of state:	

(a) The submission of a written request to the attorney	100
general by the governor, the secretary of state, the general	101
assembly, or the Ohio elections commission, alleging a violation	102
of this section;	103
(b) The filing of a complaint with the attorney general by	104
an elector of this state, alleging a violation of this section.	105
(3) If it appears to the attorney general, after	106
conducting an investigation under division (G)(2) of this	107
section, that there is probable cause to believe that a	108
violation of this section has occurred, the attorney general may	
prosecute the violation in a court of competent jurisdiction.	110
(H) When proceeding under this section, the attorney	111
general and any assistant or special counsel designated by the	112
attorney general for that purpose have all the rights,	113
privileges, and powers conferred by law on prosecuting	114
attorneys, including the power to appear before grand juries and	115
to interrogate witnesses before such grand juries. These powers	116
of the attorney general are in addition to any other applicable	117
powers of the attorney general.	118
