### **Written Proponent Testimony: House Bill 65 Make Specified Day and Week Designations Relating to Agriculture**

Thank you for the opportunity to provide this written testimony as a proponent of HB 65, which will designate several days and weeks as celebrations relating to agriculture.

The Nature Conservancy is a global organization with chapters in all 50 states and projects in over 70 countries. We are a non-partisan, science-based organization that seeks to conserve the lands and waters on which all life depends. We work collaboratively with businesses, farmers, sportsmen groups, governments, and local communities to develop pragmatic solutions to conservation challenges, including land conservation, water quality, and carbon reduction. More than 65,000 Ohioans are Nature Conservancy supporters, and we own and manage over 20,000 acres of nature preserves throughout the state.

The Nature Conservancy supports the passage of HB 65, especially the establishment of Ohio Soil Health Week. Soil Health Week would celebrate the hard and diligent work of Ohio's farmers, the importance of agriculture, and the role that healthy soil plays in sustaining our way of life. It also highlights the necessity of developing our state's youth into leaders and responsible stewards of the land.
