From the beginning of our marriage, we have been independent not receiving supplemental housing or income assistance. In fact we own our home which has been paid in full. As a proponent of HB225 I am requesting you allow other persons with a disability to be able to stand with a smile and say what they have accomplished. Your support of this bill can make there dreams come true. And they can bost of their successes.
