I am a public school high school social studies teacher, and I have dedicated the past 20 years to educating students in Ohio's public schools. I'm here to urge the committee to include the 3rd phase of the bipartisan Fair School Funding Plan in the state budget.

Public schools provide high-quality education and create opportunities for all students, regardless of their financial background. Throughout my two decades of teaching, I have primarily served students from lower-income families, and I have witnessed firsthand how access to a well-funded education can change lives. Without fair funding, Ohio will fail to provide equitable and high-quality education, widening the gap between wealthy and low-income students.
