As the mother of 6, grandmother of 19, former homeschooler, and retired teacher of thousands of students in both public and parochial schools, I am very concerned about the funding of our public schools in Ohio. Although I attended parochial schools, sent my children to parochial schools, and homeschooled for five years, I have <u>ALWAYS</u> voted for public school levies.

Why? Because I believe that our society benefits from a well-educated populace. There is less crime, fewer people on public assistance and greater economic growth in areas with excellent public schools.
