Chair Fowler, Vice Chair Odioso, Ranking Member Robinson, and members of the House Education Committee,

Thank you for the opportunity to testify today. My name is Tiffiny Underhile, and I am a public school teacher with 20 years of experience. I am here to urge the committee to fully phase in the bipartisan Fair School Funding Plan as part of Ohio's budget.

I am a proud product of the Akron Public School District, which provided me with an excellent education and the foundation to pursue a degree in education at Baldwin-Wallace University. I have taught in both the Cleveland Metropolitan School District and, for the past 15 years, the Cleveland Heights-University Heights City School District. Throughout my career, I have witnessed firsthand the consequences of underfunded public schools. I have taught in overcrowded classrooms, used outdated textbooks, and worked with limited supplies. I have seen children living in poverty struggle to have their basic needs met, and I have observed how vouchers have hurt our school budgets, making it difficult to maintain adequate staffing levels to provide students with the education they deserve.

As a mother of three children who attend Parma City Schools, I have seen my own community suffer due to the inability to pass a new levy. Meanwhile, parents increasingly turn to universal vouchers and charter schools, which drain funding from our schools without requiring these institutions to put levies on the ballot.

I ask you to consider the impact on the 90% of Ohio students who attend public schools. Please support the full phase-in of the bipartisan Fair School Funding Plan and include the necessary tools for its proper implementation in Ohio's budget.
