I am also a Registered Nurse at Riverside Hospital and am dedicated to serving my community. Therefore I think it is important that I let my voice be heard not only for my own family but on behalf of the community I proudly serve. We took him to the doctor and even got an abdominal X-ray to ensure something physical was not going on with him. All of this was caused by the distress and fear of not being able to read. Once he got his IEP and more indvidual attetnion things got better. We also have had the privilege of supplemented his education with outside tutoring using the Orton-Gillingham Method. I can confidently say, thank you to all of these interventions my son can now read! He is still behind in his grade level but he is on his own journey.

Taking away funding will not only effect my family but those around me. Also, some other hot topics to me our improving the quality of schools lunches. If budgets are cut how are we going to increase the quality of providing healthy nourishing school lunches with minimally processed food. There are many resources and studies out there linking childhood diseases such as diabetes, mental illness and obesity to what kids are fueling their bodies with.
