Chairman Holmes and Members of the Energy Committee:

My name is **Aaron Brown**, and I'm a proud **union electrician** and member of **IBEW Local Union 540 in Canton, Ohio**, with 25 years of experience building Ohio's energy future. I'm here today to offer my **strong support** for **House Bill 303**, which would establish a **community energy pilot program** here in Ohio.

As a Union Electrician who has worked in the electrical field for over 25 years, I can tell you that the way we generate and deliver electricity is changing. HB 303 is a smart step toward making sure **working-class Ohioans** benefit from that change.

This bill will mean **more jobs for skilled union electricians**, every new community energy project, whether it's a 2 MW solar array or a 500-kW rooftop system, needs to be **designed**, wired, connected, and maintained. That's what we do.

We're talking about:

- Creating good-paying jobs in clean energy construction for skilled tradespeople, opportunities for more apprentices and local hiring, long term maintenance and operations roles for trained workers, and many of these projects are shovel-ready, meaning we could get moving quickly and put boots on the ground.
- Opens the energy market to working families and small businesses
- Builds a cleaner, more reliable grid for all Ohioans

HB 303 makes sure that working people and small businesses can subscribe to community energy and save on their bills. That means more money in the pockets of **our members**, **our neighbors**, **and our local communities**.

HB 303 makes it possible for **renters**, **seniors**, **and lower**-**income households** to join a shared energy project and still see savings. That's energy **freedom**.

Ohio is going to need **more power** in the next decade — for data centers, EVs, and New Industries. We can't build a resilient grid by relying only on transmission lines and imported energy.

Distributed energy, built by **local union labor**, is part of the solution — and HB 303 helps get us there, starting with a **pilot that can be scaled**.

We in the trades stand ready to do the work. We just need the opportunity. HB 303 gives us that opportunity — fairly, responsibly, and with the right guardrails.
