

The Vocational Rehabilitation Program: How OOD helps a person (14+) with a disability find a job

Person with a disability

- Applies for OOD services online, by phone, or in person
- Can be eligible for services as young as age 14

OOD Counselor

- Determines Eligibility
- Develops Plan for Employment
- Purchases services to help participant meet their job goal

Training Programs

- Provide training for credentials (certificates, certifications, or degrees)
- Career Services for internship and job placement

Providers

- Provide services in accordance with the OOD VR Fee Schedule, such as:
 - Work Experiences
 - Job Placement
 - On-the-job Supports

Business Relations Staff

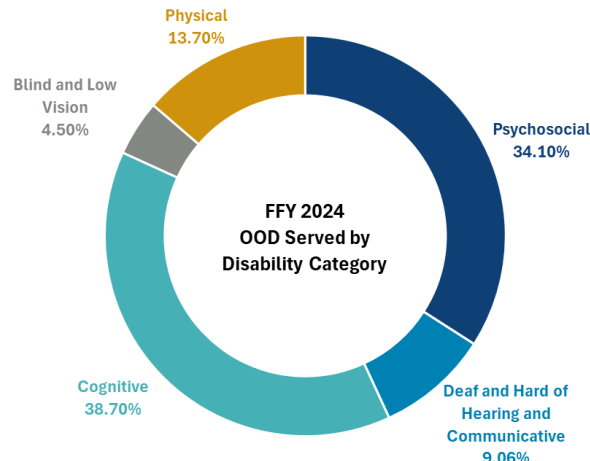
- Partner with employers to source qualified candidates for open positions
- Partner with job developers to assist candidates with hiring process

Employer

- Employer interviews and hires qualified candidates with disabilities
- Employment outcome must be competitive and integrated
