**Written Testimony of Kelly Lunneberg
Before the Ohio House Judiciary Committee
In Support of House Bill 249 — The Indecent Exposure Modernization Act**

Chair Thomas and members of the Judiciary Committee, thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony today. My name is Kelly Lunneberg, and I live in Ashtabula, Ohio. I am the mother of three beautiful and innocent children. Our home sits atop a hill overlooking our city's beach and two playgrounds, with our backyard adjoining city park property. Sadly, during Ashtabula Pride at Walnut Beach, my elementary-aged children are not protected from viewing adult entertainment from our own backyard.

The drag performances held during Pride events at Walnut Beach have featured adult entertainers who engage in indecent and sexually suggestive dancing and attire, despite the events being promoted as "family friendly." Across Ohio, children are often seen in the audience at similar public events and are even encouraged to tip money to adult performers. In many public spaces throughout our state, adult entertainers wearing prosthetic body parts and performing acts similar to those seen in 18-and-over venues are being permitted to appear before children — in parks, near playgrounds, on city streets, in libraries, and other community areas. When money and attention are involved, these performers often resort to sexually suggestive movements, gestures, and innuendo that are not appropriate for public view. House Bill 249 provides needed clarity in defining what constitutes indecent exposure in public spaces, particularly where children are present. It gives law enforcement and city officials clearer guidelines to help protect children's innocence and preserve community standards of decency.

I respectfully urge this committee to support HB 249, the Indecent Exposure Modernization Act, to ensure that public spaces remain safe and suitable for all families. Thank you for your time and consideration.
