

Chair Gross, Vice Chair Barhorst, Ranking Member Baker, and members of the House Medicaid Committee,

Thank you for allowing me to testify today. My name is Elizabeth Kimball. I am a Board Certified Family Nurse Practitioner and have served Ohioans as an FNP for more than 8 years at Lower Lights Christian Health Center in Columbus, OH. I am testifying to urge you to remove two troubling items from Ohio's state operating budget. Both could have devastating impacts on Ohio families who depend on Medicaid expansion for their healthcare coverage.

Specifically, I'm asking you to remove the following two items:

- o Section 126.70 — This Medicaid Trigger Language could immediately end Medicaid expansion in Ohio if the federal government reduces its share of paying for the program's costs.
- o Section 126.10 — Under this Federal Mirror Language, if the federal government pauses, suspends, or reduces funding for a federal program, Ohio could do the same to any similar state level program that uses federal funds.

While serving patients in primary care in Ohio I have seen how critical and life altering it is for Ohio patients to have access to preventative care, consistent access to medical care for the management of their chronic diseases and the most basic health care opportunities. Medicaid allows many hard working Ohioans to stay healthy enough to provide for their families and be functional members of society. I fear that many people will lose access to health insurance and suffer needlessly if we don't defend Medicaid.

I ask you to consider my testimony and remove these two potentially harmful items from Ohio's operating budget.
