Chair Willis, Vice Chair Daniels, Ranking Member Grim, and members of the Senate Transportation Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony regarding funding for public transportation in Ohio. I am Dawn Distler, Chief Executive Officer of the METRO Regional Transit Authority in Akron.

Public transit is a proven tool that helps achieve these goals by ensuring Ohioans have the access they need to participate fully in our state's economy.
