A quality college education builds critical thinking, a skill honed by competitive members of society. Businesses expect employees to be able to weigh options and make informed decisions. SB1 is written to discourage free dialogue in a classroom. It thwarts professors from encouraging the active participation which develops critical thinking. A great teacher engages students in the process of learning. Given a constant fear that the dialogue might be interpreted as controversial, fear of open dialogue becomes a form of censorship.
