Testimony of Amy Kelly Before the House Workforce and Higher Education Committee Rep. Tom Young, Chair March 11, 2025

Chair Young, Vice Chair Ritter, Ranking Member Piccolantonio, and Members of the Higher Education Committee:

My name is Amy Kelly, I am submitting testimony as a private citizen.

I am a lifelong Ohioan and mother of two college students. Both attend universities in Ohio. My husband and I also graduated from universities in Ohio. I am writing in opposition of Ohio SB1. This bill is said to reform and enhance Ohio education. The limitations it wants to impose will do the opposite.

SB1 wants to limit course information and discussion that deal with anything controversial. It does not want the more difficult aspects of our history to be presented. It plans to set rules against healthy debate, yet states it wants to better Ohio schools. The way to better our universities and colleges, and thus, our country, is to learn about those difficult topics and engage in discussion so that we don't repeat the actions in the future. There are aspects to American history that are shameful. But rather than fear it, we should learn from it. The goal is for students to form their own opinion can only be achieved by presenting all of the information.

SB1 also wants to eliminate programs and policies that have to do with diversity, equity, and inclusion. Ohio colleges and universities currently attract people from all over the world, and from all walks of life. Having a diverse population helps students gain insight into other cultures, other life experiences, other ways of thinking.
