HB114 – Senate Testimony

Chair <u>Brenner</u>, Vice Chair <u>Blessing</u>, Ranking Member <u>Ingraham</u>, and the members of the <u>Senate Education</u> <u>Committee</u>.....Thank you very much for inviting Representative <u>Bird</u> and I to testify today on <u>HB114</u>.

Our bill is quite simple.

- It would require public schools to admit to kindergarten any child who would be five years old by the **first day of instruction**.
 - Under current law, a local school board is permitted to use either <u>August 1st</u> or <u>September</u>
 30th as the cut-off date.
 - What we are proposing is bringing uniformity to a system that has sometimes been confusing for parents and guardians, especially for families that may be moving from one district to another.
 - I also want to make clear that our bill preserves both the "<u>referral and evaluation</u> <u>process</u>" and the "<u>student acceleration</u> <u>process</u>" currently available to families seeking early admittance for their four-year old whom they believe to be "gifted.
