

Testimony for Best Buddies in Ohio Legislation: H.B. No. 96 Testifying As: Favorable Ohio Senate Finance Committee Friday, June 6, 2025

Thank you for the opportunity to testify today. My name is Catlin Skufca, and I am the State Director for Best Buddies in Ohio. Best Buddies is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that provides opportunities for one-to-one friendships and leadership development for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Currently, we serve more than 2,000 Ohioans with and without disabilities through Best Buddies Friendship Chapters in 58 schools throughout the state.

Best Buddies is a life-changing experience for a person with intellectual disabilities. For these young people, developing social skills is essential to successfully transitioning out of school and into the working world and community life. Best Buddies also transforms attitudes regarding the needs and abilities of people with disabilities.

We are here today to ask for your support. The House has included funding for Best Buddies at \$100,000 per each year of the biennium through the Department of Developmental Disabilities. We are appealing to you to include this allocation in the Senate budget. This funding is critical to maintaining our services throughout the state, allowing youth with disabilities to gain social and leadership skills that lead to their increased sense of self-worth, employability, and independence.

I am joined today by Alex Rogers, who will share how Best Buddies has impacted her life.
