My name is Jason Wuliger, and I am the Chair of the Public Affairs Committee of the Jewish Federations of North America as well as a proud resident of Northeast Ohio. On behalf of **Jewish Federations**, I am honored to offer our strong support for HB 188, which seeks to establish the *Ohio-Israel Trade and Innovation Partnership*.

As the national umbrella organization representing over 141 Jewish Federations and communities across North America—including 8 strong, vibrant Jewish Federations throughout the state of Ohio—we applaud the Ohio General Assembly for its foresight in proposing a long-term, strategic initiative to deepen ties between the State of Ohio and the State of Israel. This partnership embodies shared values, mutual benefit, and the promise of innovation-driven economic growth.

As one of the most innovative economies in the world, Israel offers unmatched expertise in key sectors such as water technology, cybersecurity, agricultural science, and life sciences. Ohio's strengths in advanced manufacturing, logistics, research institutions, and workforce development make it a natural partner for Israel's global economic outreach.

This ensures that the Ohio-Israel Trade and



Innovation Partnership benefits from a broad range of expertise and reflects the diverse, bipartisan voices that make Ohio strong.

The proposed \$5 million annual appropriation is a prudent and forward-thinking investment. Other states with similar initiatives have seen measurable returns in terms of trade volume, startup activity, and foreign direct investment.

Jewish Federations are proud to support this legislation. It honors Ohio's longstanding commitment to its Jewish communities, while positioning the state as a leader in innovation and international cooperation. We believe this partnership will serve as a national model for constructive, bipartisan global engagement.
