Testimony Against Senate Bill 88 Submitted by: Christopher Malick Testifying as Opponent

Chair Roegner, Vice-Chair Gavarone, Ranking Member Blackshear, and members of the Senate General Government Committee,

Thank you for the opportunity to provide opponent testimony on Senate Bill 88 (SB 88).
