For us, this home is more than just a property; it is the place where we hoped to welcome our first child. It is the promise of stability, love, and family. We never imagined that a law like SB88 could suddenly take that away.

We are not investors. We are not political actors. We are simply two young students trying to build a life together. Yet SB88 tells us that because of our Chinese citizenship, we may have to sell the home we already own. This is heartbreaking.

As an expecting mother, I want to give my future child a safe and warm place to grow up. But how can I keep that promise if we are forced to sell our home? How can I explain to my child that they lost their home simply because of where their parents came from?

SB88 is not just a bill—it is a blow to families like mine. It tells us that no matter how much we love this country, no matter how hard we work, we will always be treated differently.

I beg you, please reconsider this law. Please think about the ordinary families—like mine—who are just trying to live quietly, study, and raise children here in Ohio. We are not a threat. We are neighbors, classmates, future parents. We just want a home.
