Call for balanced changes to "Foreign Property Ownership Bill" (House Bill No. 1 or Senate Bill No. 88)

Dear Representatives and Senators:

As a citizen and voter and a member of the local community in Hudson (OH), I am writing to share my concerns about Ohio House Bill No. 1 / Senate Bill No. 88 (Foreign Property Ownership Bill).

I respectfully request for your attention and advocate for the necessary and balanced changes to the bill.

- 1. S.B. No. 88 (/ H.B. No. 1) could become the most restrictive law of its kind in the country, and similar legislation in Florida is already facing legal challenges on constitutional and federal grounds a risk Ohio should avoid.
- 2. I agree with the recommendation by Ohio REALTORS® that we should look to Indiana's recently passed legislation as a more balanced model. The Indiana House Bill 1183 addresses national security concerns without creating legal uncertainty or overreach.
- 3. The bill's definitions of "protected property" and "critical infrastructure" are so broad that they would effectively cover most property in the state, far exceeding the bill's intended focus on high-risk areas.
- 4. Without a publicly accessible map or database, it would be impossible for buyers, sellers, or local officials to determine whether a property falls within a restricted area, leading to confusion and compliance challenges.
- 5. The legislation does not exempt legal permanent residents, such as green card holders. This would prohibit many law-abiding individuals who live and work in Ohio from purchasing homes and is a restriction that most other states with similar laws have avoided.
- 6. The bill lacks a mechanism to notify prospective buyers of these restrictions before they enter a transaction, which could result in unintended violations. Adding notice language to Ohio's Consumer Guide to Agency would help address this issue.
