Chairman, Members of the Committee,

America has long advertised itself as the *land of opportunity*—a place where hard work and perseverance are rewarded, regardless of where you were born. Yet SB88 and HB1 betray this promise, openly discriminating against immigrants and green card holders based solely on their country of origin. These bills do not protect Ohioans; they scapegoat them. They do not strengthen our state; they fracture it.

Who do you serve? The residents of this state include immigrants, families, and business owners who have invested their lives here. They pay taxes, contribute to our communities, and uphold the values of this nation—only to be told they are unwelcome in their own homes. This is not freedom. This is fearmongering.

These bills mirror the darkest chapters of American history: the Chinese Exclusion Act, the Alien Land Laws of the 20th century, and other racist policies that deemed certain groups "threats" based on nothing but prejudice. Now, history is repeating itself. Will this committee stand by and let it happen?

The Dangerous Precedent Set by SB88 & HB1

- 1. They punish people for their nationality—not their actions. Even legal residents and green card holders are targeted.
- 2. They invite racial profiling, empowering local officials to investigate and seize property based on suspicion, not evidence.
- 3. They hurt Ohio's economy, discouraging investment and driving away talent at a time when our state needs growth.
- 4. They violate core American principles of fairness and due process.

If this Senate truly serves *all* Ohioans, then the answer is clear: Reject SB88 and HB1. Do not let discrimination masquerade as policy. Do not let fear override justice.

I urge you to consider the legacy you wish to leave. Will Ohio be remembered for upholding liberty—or for repeating the mistakes of the past? The choice is yours.

Stop these bills. Stand with your constituents. Defend what America claims to be.
