

Chair Roegner, Vice Chair Gavarone, Ranking Member Blackshear, and members of the Senate General Government Committee, thank you for allowing me to testify today. My name is Mary Huck. I am a retired teacher and an environmentalist. I am strongly opposed to SB 153.

SB 153 makes trouble where there is none. Voter fraud is extremely rare. I remember when the guideline for getting a new driver license was that I had to supply proof of my divorce, which was done out of county so the process was very complicated and required a trip. I worked long hours teaching, and not having a dropbox would have made it difficult for me to vote. Matching names on the social security card and the driver's license down to the presence of a middle initial doesn't always happen. I have sometimes moved more often than my driver's license needs renewal, so reapplying for a drivers license would have been not just expensive, but cumbersome. Signing away my fifth amendment right if I gather signatures for a ballot initiative sounds scary and like unnecessary scrutiny.

I ask you to consider my testimony and vote *NO* on this unnecessary and unAmerican bill. Thank you again for the opportunity to testify.
