As an attorney, I often act as guardian for the elderly or incompetent. A loss these pharmacies will leave this vulnerable population with a loss of access to the medication they need and just as importantly a loss of a caring friend to keep an eye on them.

To the community, there is a loss of a local business and a loss of jobs which of course has a negative economic impact. The pharmacists I know are some of the most giving individuals. But a loss of their livelihood will undoubtedly impact their ability to support the local community. We need to protect these small businesses. It is for this reason that I support HB 96.
