Chairman Roegner, vice chair Cirino, Ranking Member Ingram, and members of the Senate committee:

My name is Redeat Getachew. I am a first-generation 2nd year student at The Ohio State University studying Political Science. I am an out of state student from our country's capital, District of Columbia. I write this testimony to state my strong opposition to Senate Bill 1 and to implore you to not pass it.

I was born in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia and when I was six, my parents made the brave decision to move to America in search of the bountiful resources and bright future the US offers. Growing up, my parents always emphasized the importance of education. They encouraged me to join clubs, participate and be curious in and outside of the classroom and take the opportunity they have given me to build myself a successful and happy future. These lessons were what I had in mind when I began looking for colleges to apply to. I applied to 13 schools but none of them had captured my interest and awe like the way The Ohio State University did.
