Chair Roegner, Vice Chair Cirino, Ranking Member Ingram, and members of the Senate Higher Education Committee,

Thank you for allowing me to testify today. My name is Andrew Pardi. I have earned an Associates, a Bachelor's Degree, and a Master's Degree in Social Work through the University of Cincinnati. My higher education experience was greatly improved by my exposure to diverse people through language learning and study abroad as well as classes that gave me greater understanding of concepts such as equity and inclusion. I have seen zero evidence demonstrating how SB1 and its companion bill HB 6 would make our schools or world better for anyone or even what "problem" these bills are supposed to help.
