Thank you for allowing me to testify today. My name is Emily Koivu and I am a Columbus, Ohio resident. Currently, I am a PhD student in the state of Ohio, and I am strongly opposed to SB-1 and its companion bill HB 6.

As a student and researcher, this bill would dramatically hinder the functioning of colleges across the state. The harmful initiatives in this bill will provide unnecessary red tape in classrooms, include damaging curriculum requirements, and would have a dire impact on research initiatives here.
