Chair Roegner, Vice Chair Cirino, Ranking Member Ingram, and members of the Senate Higher Education Committee,

Thank you for allowing me to testify today. My name is Celeste Irving. I am an Ohio resident, an educator, a OSU graduate and a mother of two children whose futures are both bright and shadowed. I am strongly opposed to SB 1 and its companion bill HB 6.

I oppose this bill and its companion because we need challenging views, thoughtful ideas, and the ability to ask questions of our brightest. This is what makes people grow. Without growth we become a stagnant society that will slip backwards into inaction, thoughtlessness, and the inability to make real progress at a time when we so desperately need it.
