Chair Roegner, Vice Chair Cirino, Ranking Member Ingram, and members of the Senate Higher Education Committee,

Thank you for allowing me to testify today. My name is Caleb Cain. I am a college student living in Ohio. I am strongly opposed to SB 1 and its companion bill HB 6.

As a current college student, I have seen the immense benefits of classes discussing "controversial" subjects.
