

Testimony for Best Buddies in Ohio H.B. No. 96 Position: Favorable Ohio Senate Medicaid Committee Thursday, May 15, 2025 at 9:00AM Finance Hearing Room

Thank you for the opportunity to testify today. My name is Catlin Skufca, and I am the State Director for Best Buddies in Ohio. Best Buddies is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that provides opportunities for one-to-one friendships and leadership development for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Currently, we serve more than 2,000 Ohioans with and without disabilities through Best Buddies Chapters in 58 schools throughout the state.

Best Buddies is a life-changing experience for a person with intellectual disabilities. For these young people, developing social skills is essential to successfully transitioning out of school and into the working world and community life. Best Buddies also transforms attitudes regarding the needs and abilities of people with disabilities.

We are here today to ask for your support of Chairman Romanchuk's budget amendment, which would fund Best Buddies at \$150,000 per year for each year of the biennium through the Department of Developmental Disabilities. This funding is critical to maintaining our services throughout the state, allowing youth with disabilities to gain social and leadership skills that lead to their increased sense of self-worth, employability, and independence.

I am joined today by a Best Buddies friendship match, Rory Fellows and Alicia Scoggins from Central Crossing High School, who will share how Best Buddies has impacted them.

Best Buddies has taught me something truly important: at our core, all people are more alike than we are different. I was matched with my buddy, Alicia, and getting to know her has been one of the most meaningful parts of my life. Alicia radiates confidence; she knows what she wants and goes after it. No matter the day, she always finds a way to make me laugh. Through Alicia, I've come to see she has the same hopes, dreams, and determination as anyone else. Being in a different classroom does not make her any less driven or capable. Best Buddies allows students like Alicia to be involved, feel seen, and be part of the school community.

This mission is also deeply personal for me. My uncle, who has a disability, grew up in the 1960s. No two people are the same, which makes these friendships so powerful. Alicia has truly changed my life, and I hope more students can have the chance to connect with someone like her.
