The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Pursuant to House Rule No. 25, the Clerk called the House to order.

Representative Mathews, A. was selected to preside under the Rule.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills and joint resolution were introduced:

H. B. No. 1001 - Representative Newman.

To amend sections 323.11 and 4503.06 of the Revised Code to disallow property taxes from being a lien on property and instead requiring them to be the personal liability of the property owner, to require county treasurers to abate delinquent taxes on property owned by senior citizens or certain disabled veterans, and to name this act the Private Property Protection Act.

H. B. No. 1002 - Representative Manning.

To amend section 121.31 of the Revised Code to add four members of the General Assembly to the Commission on Hispanic-Latino Affairs.

H. B. No. 1003 - Representatives Tims, Jarrells.

To amend section 5747.01 and to enact sections 1749.01, 1749.02, and 1749.04 of the Revised Code regarding institutional investors bidding on, and the use of federal depreciation and interest deductions against the state income tax with respect to, certain residential property and to name this act the Neighborhood Protection Act.

H. B. No. 1004 - Representatives Bird, John.

To amend sections 4723.4812 and 4729.284; to enact section 4729.286; and to repeal section 4731.90 of the Revised Code to revise the law governing pharmacist dispensing of nicotine replacement therapy and to authorize pharmacists to dispense oral contraceptive therapy pursuant to protocols developed by the State Board of Pharmacy.

H. B. No. 1005 - Representative John.

To enact section 5167.052 of the Revised Code regarding Medicaid managed care organization payment rates for durable medical equipment, complex rehab technology, prosthetics, orthotics, and supplies.

H. B. No. 1006 - Representative Mathews, T.
Cosponsor: Representative Klopfenstein.

To enact section 921.32 of the Revised Code to limit manufacturer liability for failure-to-warn claims if a pesticide's label complies with specified requirements.

H. J. R. No. 10 - Representatives LaRe, Miller, K.

Proposing to enact Section 2b of Article XII of the Constitution of the State of Ohio to partially exempt the increased value of owner-occupied residences from taxation.

Said bills and joint resolution were considered the first time.
