The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 1007 - Representative Hiner.

To amend section 149.43 of the Revised Code to prevent the release, under Ohio Public Records Law, of certain personal information of a clerk of court.

H. B. No. 1008 - Representatives Troy, Grim.

Cosponsors: Representatives Brennan, Brewer, Sims, Synenberg.

To amend sections 173.541 and 5163.33 of the Revised Code regarding the Medicaid personal needs allowance for individuals eligible for the Medicaid-funded assisted living program and for residents of nursing homes and ICFs/IID.

H. B. No. 1009 - Representatives Newman, Willis.

Cosponsors: Representatives Click, Lear, Lampton, Daniels, Hall, T., King, Klopfenstein, Peterson, Barhorst, Richardson.

To enact sections 5507.01, 5507.02, and 5507.99 of the Revised Code to regulate the use of automated license plate recognition systems and mass surveillance technology and to name this act the Stop Flock Abuse Act.

H. B. No. 1010 - Representative Dean.

Cosponsors: Representatives Ferguson, Teska, Gross, Rader, Mullins.

To enact sections 5507.01, 5507.02, 5507.03, 5507.031, 5507.04, 5507.05, 5507.06, 5507.07, and 5507.99 of the Revised Code to regulate the use of automated license plate recognition systems and mass surveillance technology and to name this act the Ohio Freedom from Mass Surveillance Act.

H. B. No. 1011 - Representative Click.

Cosponsor: Representative Workman.

To enact sections 5507.01, 5507.02, and 5507.03 of the Revised Code to limit the use of automated license plate recognition systems and mass surveillance technology for one year, to repeal sections 5507.01, 5507.02, and

5507.03 of the Revised Code one year after the effective date, to abolish the General Assembly limitations governing such systems and technology at that time, and to name this act the 1984 No More Act.

Said bills were considered the first time.
