The director shall inspect the school facilities and equipment of applicants and licensees and examine applicants for instructor's licenses.	38

(2) The director shall adopt rules governing online driver education courses that may be completed via the internet to satisfy the classroom instruction under division (C) of this section. The rules shall do all of the following:	46
(a) Establish standards that an online driver training enterprise must satisfy to be licensed to offer an online driver education course via the internet, including, at a minimum, proven expertise in providing driver education and an acceptable infrastructure capable of providing secure online driver education in accord with advances in internet technology. The rules shall allow an online driver training enterprise to be affiliated with a licensed driver training school offering in-person classroom instruction, but shall not require such an affiliation.	50
(b) Establish content requirements that an online driver education course must satisfy to be approved as equivalent to twenty-four hours of in-person classroom instruction;	60

(D) The rules shall state the minimum hours for classroom

and behind-the-wheel instruction required for beginning drivers

of commercial trucks, commercial cars, buses, and commercial

(E) (1) The department of public safety may charge a fee to 103
each online driver training enterprise in an amount sufficient 104
to pay the actual expenses the department incurs in the 105
regulation of online driver education courses. 106

(2) The department shall supply to each licensed online 107
driver training enterprise certificates to be used for 108
certifying an applicant's enrollment in an approved online 109
driver education course and a separate certificate to be issued 110
upon successful completion of an approved online driver 111
education course. The certificates shall be numbered serially. 112
The department may charge a fee to each online driver training 113

Vehicular assault in violation of the Move Over Law 120

R.C. 2903.08; R.C. 4508.02 (technical) 121

Regarding the newly created offense that prohibits a 122
person from causing serious physical harm with a motor vehicle 123
by failing to comply with the Move Over Law, reconciles the 124
offense's penalties with its vehicular manslaughter counterpart 125
by reducing both of the following: 126

1. The base penalty from a first degree misdemeanor to a third degree misdemeanor (the corresponding vehicular manslaughter penalty is a second degree misdemeanor);	127 128 129
2. The enhanced penalty from a fourth degree felony to a second degree misdemeanor (the corresponding vehicular manslaughter penalty is a first degree misdemeanor).	130 131 132
