SUMMARY

 Requires the Registrar of Motor Vehicles to send a notice at least 14 days prior to a driver's license expiring.

DETAILED ANALYSIS

Notice for expiring driver's license

The bill requires the Registrar of Motor Vehicles to send a notice to each person whose driver's license is scheduled to expire at least 14 days before the expiration date. Currently, the Registrar must notify each person whose driver's license has expired within 45 days after the expiration date.¹

Under continuing law, the notice must be made by regular mail sent to the person's last known address shown in the Bureau of Motor Vehicles' records. A driver's license may be renewed up to 90 days in advance of its expiration date and, if expired, must be renewed within six months after its expiration date or the licensee will be required to retake the written and skills tests.²
