BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 122.97 of the Revised Code be	3
enacted to read as follows:	4
Sec. 122.97. (A) The Ohio international trade commission	5
is created. The commission shall, as between Ohio and Japan,	6
Ireland, Israel, and two other nations designated by the	7
director of development, advance all of the following:	8
(1) Multilateral trade and investment;	9
(2) Joint research agreements on issues of mutual	10
interest, particularly with Israel regarding electronic and	11
cyber warfare capabilities;	12
(3) Business and academic exchanges;	13
(4) Creation of technology centers to promote	14
collaboration between academic and business interests;	15
(5) Mutual economic support;	16
(6) Mutual investment in infrastructure;	17

(7) Other issues as determined by the commission.	18
(B) The commission shall consist of the following members:	19
(1) Three members of the senate, appointed by the	20
president of the senate, who have knowledge of, or current or	21
past involvement in, organizations that promote international	22
affairs or have interest in the well-being of trade relations	23
between this state and the nations specified in division (A) of	24
this section;	25
(2) Three members of the house of representatives,	26
appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, who	27
have knowledge of, or current or past involvement in,	28
organizations that promote international affairs or have	29
interest in the well-being of trade relations between this state	30
and the nations specified in division (A) of this section;	31
(3) Eight members appointed by and with the mutual consent	32
of the director of development and the adjutant general, with	33
the advice and consent of the senate, who shall consist of the	34
<pre>following:</pre>	35
(a) One member who represents the nonprofit corporation	36
formed under section 187.01 of the Revised Code;	37
(b) One member who represents the Japanese export trade	38
organization or, if such individual is unavailable, one member	39
who represents Japanese-American communities or interest in this	4 C
state;	41
(c) One member who represents Israeli-American communities	42
or interest in this state;	43
(d) One member who represents Irish-American communities	4 4
or interest in this state:	4 5

(e) Two members who represent the communities or interest	46
in this state of one of the two nations designated by the	47
director of development pursuant to division (A) of this	48
<pre>section;</pre>	49
(f) Two members who represent the communities or interest	50
in this state of the other of the two nations designated by the	51
director of development pursuant to division (A) of this section	52
that is not represented under division (A)(3)(e) of this	53

(C) Initial members of the commission shall be appointed	55
not later than ninety days after the effective date of this	56
section. Members of the commission appointed under divisions (B)	57
(1) and (2) of this section shall serve terms of two years or	58
for the remainder of the member's legislative term, whichever is	59
less. Members of the commission appointed under division (B)(3)	60
of this section shall serve terms of four years. Any vacancy on	61
the commission shall be filled in the same manner as the	62
original appointment.	63
(D) Members of the commission shall serve without	64
compensation.	65
(E)(1) The commission shall meet and hold hearings at the	66
places it designates throughout the state.	67
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(2) The board of directors of the nonprofit corporation	68
formed under section 187.01 of the Revised Code shall select a	69
chairperson from among the members of the commission. The	70
chairperson may appoint from the commission members of	71
subcommittees and subcommittee chairpersons at the chairperson's	72
discretion.	73
(3) A majority of the members of the commission	74

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constitutes a quorum for the transaction of the business of the	75
commission.	76
(F) Not later than fifteen months after the effective date	77
of this section, and annually thereafter, the commission shall	78
issue a report of its activities during the preceding year, and	79
any associated findings and recommendations, to the governor,	80
the president of the senate, and the speaker of the house of	81
representatives.	82
(G) The commission may raise funds through direct	83
solicitation or other fundraising events alone, or with other	84
groups, and accept gifts, grants, and bequests from individuals,	85
corporations, foundations, governmental agencies, and public and	86
private organizations and institutions. The funds, gifts,	87
grants, or bequests received pursuant to this section shall be	88
deposited to the Ohio international trade commission fund, which	89
is created in the state treasury. The commission shall use the	90
fund to defray the commission's administrative expenses and to	91
carry out its purposes set forth in this section.	92
