To amend section 5167.12 and to enact sections	1
3902.65, 4729.362, and 5164.093 of the Revised	2
Code regarding prescription drug readers for	3
visually impaired patients.	4

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 5167.12 be amended and sections	5
3902.65, 4729.362, and 5164.093 of the Revised Code be enacted	6
to read as follows:	7
Sec. 3902.65. (A) Notwithstanding section 3901.71 of the	8
Revised Code, a health benefit plan shall provide coverage for	9
prescription readers provided by a licensed terminal distributor	10
of dangerous drugs pursuant to section 4729.362 of the Revised	11
Code.	12
(B) As used in this section, "prescription reader" has the	13
same meaning as in section 4729.362 of the Revised Code.	14
Sec. 4729.362. (A)(1) Except as provided in division (B)	15
of this section, prior to selling a dangerous drug at retail, a	16
licensed terminal distributor of dangerous drugs shall provide	17

notice, in the manner specified in division (A)(2) of this	18
section, that a prescription reader can be made available. If	19
the person purchasing the drug requests a prescription reader,	20
the terminal distributor shall provide a prescription reader for	21
at least the duration of the prescription and shall ensure that	22
the label affixed to the container in which the drug is	23
dispensed is compatible with the prescription reader.	24
(2) A licensed terminal distributor shall provide the	25
notice required by division (A)(1) of this section as follows:	26
(a) For in-person transactions, the notice shall be	27
provided to the purchaser of the drug if the licensed terminal	28
distributor has reason to believe that the purchaser is blind or	29
visually impaired or is purchasing the drug on behalf of a	30
patient who is blind or visually impaired.	31
(b) For transactions in which the drug will be delivered	32
to a patient by mail, parcel post, or common carrier, the notice	33
shall be provided to the person purchasing the drug.	34
(B) This section does not apply in either of the following	35
circumstances:	36
(1) When the drug is personally furnished by a licensed	37
health professional authorized to prescribe drugs;	38
(2) When the licensed terminal distributor dispensing the	39
drug is any of the following:	40
(a) An institutional pharmacy;	41
(b) A pharmacy participating in the drug repository	42
program pursuant to section 3715.871 of the Revised Code, but	43
only if the drug being dispensed was donated or given under the	44
program;	45

(c) A pharmacy in a jail, state correctional institution,	46
federal correctional facility or complex, or juvenile detention	47
facility;	48
(d) A pharmacy operated by a government entity.	49
(C) This section does not affect any law relative to	50
labeling requirements for drugs.	51
(D) As used in this section:	52
(1) "Dangerous drug" has the same meaning as set forth in	53
division (F) of section 4729.01 of the Revised Code.	54
(2) "Institutional pharmacy" means a pharmacy that is part	55
of or is operated in conjunction with any of the following	56
health care facilities: an ambulatory surgical facility, nursing	57
home, residential care facility, freestanding rehabilitation	58
facility, hospice care program, home and community-based	59
services provider, or residential facility for individuals with	60
mental illness or developmental disabilities. "Institutional	61
pharmacy" includes both of the following:	62
(a) A pharmacy on the premises of a health care facility	63
identified in division (D)(2) of this section that provides a	64
system of distributing and supplying medication to the facility	65
or its patients, whether or not operated by the facility;	66
(b) A pharmacy off the premises of a health care facility	67
identified in division (D)(2) of this section that provides	68
services only to patients of one or more health care facilities.	69
(3) "Terminal distributor of dangerous drugs" has the same	70
meaning as set forth in division (Q) of section 4729.01 of the	71
Revised Code, and specifically includes retail pharmacies, as	72
well as mail-order or other pharmacies that deliver dangerous	73

drugs by mail, parcel post, or common carrier.	74
(4) "Prescription reader" means a device that audibly	75
conveys the information that is required by law or rule to be	76
contained on a label affixed to the container in which a	77
dangerous drug is dispensed for a patient who is visually	78
impaired or otherwise would have difficulty reading the label.	79
The information to be audibly conveyed shall include any	80
cautions that may be required by federal and state law and any	81
information regarding drug interactions, contraindications, and	82
side effects that are also provided to sighted patients and	83
patients who have no difficulty reading the label.	84
Sec. 5164.093. (A) The medicaid program shall cover	85
prescription readers provided by a licensed terminal distributor	86
of dangerous drugs pursuant to section 4729.362 of the Revised	87
Code.	88
(B) As used in this section, "prescription reader" has the	89
same meaning as in section 4729.362 of the Revised Code.	90
Sec. 5167.12. If prescribed drugs are included in the care	91
management system:	92
(A) Medicaid MCO plans may include strategies for the	93
management of drug utilization, but any such strategies are	94
subject to the limitations and requirements of this section and	95
the approval of the department of medicaid.	96
(B) A medicaid MCO plan shall not impose a prior	97
authorization requirement in the case of a drug to which all of	98
the following apply:	99
(1) The drug is an antidepressant or antipsychotic.	100
(2) The drug is administered or dispensed in a standard	101

tablet or capsule form, except that in the case of an102antipsychotic, the drug also may be administered or dispensed in103a long-acting injectable form.104

(3) The drug is prescribed by any of the following: 105

(a) A physician who has registered the physician'spsychiatric specialty with the department;107

(b) A psychiatrist who is practicing at a location on
behalf of a community mental health services provider whose
mental health services are certified by the department of mental
health and addiction services under section 5119.36 of the
Revised Code;

(c) A certified nurse practitioner, as defined in section
4723.01 of the Revised Code, who is certified in psychiatric
mental health by a national certifying organization approved by
the board of nursing under section 4723.46 of the Revised Code;

(d) A clinical nurse specialist, as defined in section
4723.01 of the Revised Code, who is certified in psychiatric
mental health by a national certifying organization approved by
the board of nursing under section 4723.46 of the Revised Code.
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(4) The drug is prescribed for a use that is indicated on
the drug's labeling, as approved by the federal food and drug
administration.

(C) The department shall authorize a medicaid MCO plan to
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include a pharmacy utilization management program under which
prior authorization through the program is established as a
condition of obtaining a controlled substance pursuant to a
prescription.

(D) Each medicaid managed care organization and medicaid 129

MCO plan shall comply with sections 5164.091, <u>5164.093</u>, <u>5164.10</u>, 130
5164.7511, 5164.7512, and 5164.7514 of the Revised Code as if
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the organization were the department and the plan were the
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medicaid program. **Section 2.** That existing section 5167.12 of the Revised
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Code is hereby repealed.

Section 3. Section 3902.65 of the Revised Code, as enacted136by this act, applies only to health benefit plans, as defined in137section 3922.01 of the Revised Code, delivered, issued for138delivery, modified, or renewed in this state on or after the139effective date of this section.140
