"Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state 5
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 6
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 7
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 8
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 9
in division (B) of this section. 10

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 11
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 12

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 13
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 14
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 15
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 16
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 17



quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 18
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 19
other abortion-related activities. 20

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 21
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 22
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 23
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 24
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 25
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 26
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 27
other money in that fund. 28

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 29
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 30
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 31
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 32

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 33
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 34
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 35
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 36
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 37
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 38
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 39
directly to their clients. 40

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 41
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 42
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 43
it receives under this section to assist those who have 44
pancreatic cancer and their families. 45

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 46

receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 47
Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 48
contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 49
support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 50

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 51
receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 52
St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 53
its research and other programs. 54

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 55
receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 56
special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 57
for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 58

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 59
receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 60
children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 61
contributions for its research and other programs. 62

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 63
receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 64
the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 65
raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 66
pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 67

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 68
receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 69
the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 70
children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 71
research for the cure of childhood cancers. 72

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 73
receives pursuant to section 4503.4912 of the Revised Code to 74
the Ben Morrison memorial fund, which shall use the 75

contributions for scholarships and other programs that support	76
mental health.	77
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	78
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the	79
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the	80
contributions into its general account to be used for	81
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of	82

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	84

extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay	87
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.	88
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	89
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio	90

scholarships and other educational activities.	92
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	93
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the	94

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	98

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 108
pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 109
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 110
organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 111
need. 112

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 113
receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 114
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 115
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 116

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 117
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 118
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 119
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 120
section. A university or college that receives contributions 121
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 122
scholarship fund. 123

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 124
receives pursuant to section 4503.512 of the Revised Code to the 125
Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Incorporated Delta Theta Omega 126
chapter in Ohio. The Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Incorporated 127
Delta Theta Omega chapter shall use the contributions for the 128
development and perpetuation of scholarship, leadership, 129
citizenship, fidelity, and brotherhood among men and youth in 130
this state. 131

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 132
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 133

university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 134
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 135
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 136
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 137
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 138
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 139
funds as provided in this section. 140

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 141
receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 142
Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 143
of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 144
attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 145
funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 146
program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 147
with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 148
funds as provided in this section. 149

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 150
receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 151
university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 152
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 153
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 154
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 155
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 156
university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 157
funds as provided in this section. 158

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 159
receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 160
Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 161
contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 162

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 163

receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code 164
equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of 165
Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen 166
advocates for addiction recovery). 167

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 168
receives pursuant to section 4503.520 of the Revised Code to 169
Purdue university in West Lafayette, Indiana, for purposes of 170
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 171
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 172
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 173
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with 174
Purdue university to effectuate the distribution of such funds 175
as provided in this section. 176

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 177
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 178
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 179
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 180
cyclists of all ages. 181

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 182
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 183
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 184
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 185
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 186
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 187
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 188

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 189
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 190
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 191
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 192
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 193

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the contributions only to promote and support the football team of Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the United States power squadron district seven which shall annually distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron district shall use the money it receives under this section to pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or sponsors within this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis international, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services to children, young adults, and families in this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it receives under this section to provide educational scholarships to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession,

to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 224
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 225
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 226
the improvement of patient outcomes. 227

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 228
receives pursuant to section 4503.53 of the Revised Code to the 229
Indiana Kentucky Ohio regional council of carpenters. The 230
council shall use the money it receives to assist its members 231
who are experiencing financial hardship. 232

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 233
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 234
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 235
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 236
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 237
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 238
personnel, veterans, and their families. 239

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 240
receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the 241
Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for 242
the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house. 243

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 244
receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the 245
nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry 246
health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to 247
further the nonprofit's mission. 248

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 249
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 250
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 251
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 252

families.	253
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.536 of the Revised Code to save a warrior, incorporated, which shall use the contributions to prevent suicide by active members of the armed forces of the United States, veterans of those armed forces, and first responders.	254 255 256 257 258 259

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the	281

designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 285
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 286
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 287
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 288
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 289
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 290
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 291

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 292
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 293
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 294

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 295
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 296
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 297
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 298
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 299
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 300
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 301
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 302
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 303
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 304
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 305
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 306
under this section. 307

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 308
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 309
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 310
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 311

programs. 312

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 313
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 314
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 315
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 316

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 317
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 318
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 319
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 320
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 321

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 322
receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 323
central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 324
which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 325
Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 326
the person who paid the contribution resides. 327

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 328
receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to 329
playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use 330
the contributions to further its mission of presenting and 331
producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing 332
arts education, and creating a superior destination for 333
entertainment, business, and residential living. 334

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 335
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 336
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 337
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 338
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 339
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 340

ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 341
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 342
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 343
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 344
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 345
such payments are to be made. 346

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 347
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 348
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 349
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 350
river watershed. 351

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 352
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 353
Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 354
nature preserve. 355

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 356
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 357
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 358
the money in support of the park. 359

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 360
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 361
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 362
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 363

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 364
receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 365
girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 366
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 367

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 368
receives pursuant to section 4503.569 of the Revised Code to the 369

Ohio bird sanctuary, located in Mansfield, Ohio, which shall use 370
the contributions for purposes of its operations, bird care and 371
rehabilitation, and educational programs. 372

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 373
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 374
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 375
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 376
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 377
local beekeeping programs. 378

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 379
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 380
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 381
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 382
legends to inspire future leaders. 383

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 384
receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 385
keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 386
contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 387
to take greater responsibility for improving the local 388
environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 389
greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 390

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 391
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 392
Ohio state coalition-national council of negro women, 393
incorporated, which shall use the contributions for educational 394
purposes. 395

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 396
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 397
Ohio past detachment commander's club, inc., which shall use the 398

contributions to support the activities of the organization. 399

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 400
receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the 401
progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which 402
shall use the contributions to support the activities of the 403
center. 404

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 405
receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the 406
American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the 407
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 408

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 409
receives, or has received, pursuant to section 4503.584 of the 410
Revised Code to the Ohio natural energy foundation to fund 411
scholarships for students pursuing careers in the oil and 412
natural gas industry. 413

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 414
receives pursuant to section 4503.585 of the Revised Code to the 415
Terrace Park recreation committee, inc. to offer scholarships to 416
young athletes of, and maintain athletic facilities in, the 417
municipal corporation of Terrace Park. 418

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 419
receives pursuant to section 4503.586 of the Revised Code to the 420
Ohio mountain bike alliance. 421

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 422
receives pursuant to section 4503.588 of the Revised Code to the 423
Ohio grange patrons of husbandry foundation, which shall use the 424
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 425

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 426

pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 427
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 428
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 429
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 430
commission and that is participating in the license plate 431
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 432
of the county of residence of an applicant. 433

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 434
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 435
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 436
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 437
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 438
(G) of that section. 439

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 440
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 441
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 442
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 443
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 444
Ohio and for educational programs. 445

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 446
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 447
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 448
supporting cancer research. 449

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 450
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 451
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 452

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 453
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 454
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 455

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.598 of the Revised Code equally to the Jackson local schools foundation and the Jackson high school alumni association. The foundation and alumni association shall use the contributions for the foundation's and alumni association's purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl scouts.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the

charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 485
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 486

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 487
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 488

which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 490

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 491

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 515
