BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1 . That sections 3501.11, 3503.14, 3503.20,	5
3503.28, and 3509.03 be amended and section 3509.11 of the	6
Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	7
Sec. 3501.11. Each board of elections shall exercise by a	8
majority vote all powers granted to the board by Title XXXV of	9
the Revised Code, shall perform all the duties imposed by law,	10
and shall do all of the following:	11
(A) Establish, define, provide, rearrange, and combine	12
election precincts;	13
(B) Fix and provide the places for registration and for	14
holding primaries and elections;	15
(C) Provide for the purchase, preservation, and	16
maintenance of booths, ballot boxes, books, maps, flags, blanks,	17
cards of instructions, and other forms, papers, and equipment	18

used in registration, nominations, and elections;	19
(D) Appoint and remove its director, deputy director, and	20
employees and all registrars, precinct election officials, and	21
other officers of elections, fill vacancies, and designate the	22
ward or district and precinct in which each shall serve;	23
(E) Make and issue rules and instructions, not	24
inconsistent with law or the rules, directives, or advisories	25
issued by the secretary of state, as it considers necessary for	26
the guidance of election officers and voters;	27
(F) Advertise and contract for the printing of all ballots	28
and other supplies used in registrations and elections;	29
(G) Provide for the issuance of all notices,	30
advertisements, and publications concerning elections, except as	31
otherwise provided in division (G) of section 3501.17 and	32
divisions (F) and (G) of section 3505.062 of the Revised Code;	33
(H) Provide for the delivery of ballots, pollbooks, and	34
other required papers and material to the polling places;	35
(I) Cause the polling places to be suitably provided with	36
voting machines, marking devices, automatic tabulating	37
equipment, stalls, and other required supplies. In fulfilling	38
this duty, each board of a county that uses voting machines,	39
marking devices, or automatic tabulating equipment shall conduct	40
a full vote of the board during a public session of the board on	41
the allocation and distribution of voting machines, marking	42
devices, and automatic tabulating equipment for each precinct in	43
the county.	44
(J) Investigate irregularities, nonperformance of duties,	45
or violations of Title XXXV of the Revised Code by election	46
officers and other persons; administer oaths, issue subpoenas,	47

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summon witnesses, and compel the production of books, papers,	48
records, and other evidence in connection with any such	49
investigation; and report the facts to the prosecuting attorney	50
or the secretary of state;	51
(K)(1) Review, examine, and certify the sufficiency and	52
validity of petitions and nomination papers, and, after	53
certification, return to the secretary of state all petitions	54
and nomination papers that the secretary of state forwarded to	55
the board;	56
(2) Examine each initiative petition, or a petition filed	57
under section 307.94 or 307.95 of the Revised Code, received by	58
the board to determine whether the petition falls within the	59
scope of authority to enact via initiative and whether the	60
petition satisfies the statutory prerequisites to place the	61
issue on the ballot, as described in division (M) of section	62
3501.38 of the Revised Code. The petition shall be invalid if	63
any portion of the petition is not within the initiative power.	64
(L) Receive the returns of elections, canvass the returns,	65
make abstracts of them, and transmit those abstracts to the	66
<pre>proper authorities;</pre>	67
(M) Issue certificates of election on forms to be	68
prescribed by the secretary of state;	69
(N) Make an annual report to the secretary of state, on	70
the form prescribed by the secretary of state, containing a	71
statement of the number of voters registered, elections held,	72
votes cast, appropriations received, expenditures made, and	73
other data required by the secretary of state;	74
(O) Prepare and submit to the proper appropriating officer	75
a budget estimating the cost of elections for the ensuing fiscal	76

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year;	77
(P) Perform other duties as prescribed by law or the	78
rules, directives, or advisories of the secretary of state;	79
(Q) Investigate and determine the residence qualifications	80
of electors;	81
(R) Administer oaths in matters pertaining to the	82
administration of the election laws;	83
(S) Prepare and submit to the secretary of state, whenever	84
the secretary of state requires, a report containing the names	85
and residence addresses of all incumbent county, municipal,	86
township, and board of education officials serving in their	87
respective counties;	88
(T) Establish and maintain a voter registration database	89
of all qualified electors in the county who offer to register;	90
(U) Maintain voter registration records, make reports	91
concerning voter registration as required by the secretary of	92
state, and remove ineligible electors from voter registration	93
lists in accordance with law and directives of the secretary of	94
state;	95
(V) Give approval to ballot language for any local	96
question or issue and transmit the language to the secretary of	97
state for the secretary of state's final approval;	98
(W) Prepare and cause the following notice to be displayed	99
in a prominent location in every polling place:	100
"NOTICE	101
Ohio law prohibits any person from voting or attempting to	102
vote more than once at the same election.	103

Violators are guilty of a felony of the fourth degree and	104
shall be imprisoned and additionally may be fined in accordance	105
with law."	106
(X) In all cases of a tie vote or a disagreement in the	107
board, if no decision can be arrived at, the director or	108
chairperson shall submit the matter in controversy, not later	109
than fourteen days after the tie vote or the disagreement, to	110
the secretary of state, who shall summarily decide the question,	111
and the secretary of state's decision shall be final.	112
(Y) Assist each designated agency, deputy registrar of	113
motor vehicles, public high school and vocational school, public	114
library, and office of a county treasurer in the implementation	115
of a program for registering voters at all voter registration	116
locations as prescribed by the secretary of state. Under this	117
program, each board of elections shall direct to the appropriate	118
board of elections any voter registration applications for	119
persons residing outside the county where the board is located	120
within five days after receiving the applications.	121
(Z) On any day on which an elector may vote in person at	122
the office of the board or at another site designated by the	123
board, consider the board or other designated site a polling	124
place for that day. All requirements or prohibitions of law that	125
apply to a polling place shall apply to the office of the board	126
or other designated site on that day.	127
(AA) Perform any duties with respect to voter registration	128
and voting by uniformed services and overseas voters that are	129
delegated to the board by law or by the rules, directives, or	130
advisories of the secretary of state.	131

(BB) Prepare an election administration plan and submit it

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to the secretary of state not later than seventy-five days	133
before each presidential primary election and not later than one	134
hundred twenty days before each general election held in an	135
even-numbered year. The election administration plan shall be on	136
a template prescribed by the secretary of state and shall	137
include all of the following:	138
(1) Precinct election official recruitment, training, and	139
accountability;	140
(2) Resource allocation;	141
(3) Communication before and on the day of the election;	142
(4) Materials;	143
(5) Contingencies and continuity planning;	144
(6) Security;	145
(7) Voter registration;	146
(8) Absent voting;	147
(9) Polling places and accessibility;	148
(10) Ballot preparation;	149
(11) Pre-election testing;	150
(12) Reconciliation and audits;	151
(13) A master calendar;	152
(14) Any other topic prescribed by the secretary of state.	153
(CC) Establish and maintain a permanent absent voter list	154
of all registered electors in the county who have opted to be	155
placed on the permanent absent voter list, including written	156
applications to be removed from the permanent absent voter list.	157

Sec. 3503.14. (A) The secretary of state shall prescribe	158
the form and content of the registration, change of residence,	159
and change of name forms used in this state. The forms shall	160
meet the requirements of the National Voter Registration Act of	161
1993 and shall include spaces for all of the following:	162
(1) The voter's name;	163
(2) The voter's address;	164
(3) The current date;	165
(4) The voter's date of birth;	166
(5) The voter to provide at least one of the following	167
forms of identification:	168
(a) The voter's Ohio driver's license or state	169
<pre>identification card number;</pre>	170
(b) The last four digits of the voter's social security	171
number.	172
(6) A box that the voter can mark in the affirmative to	173
request to be placed on the permanent absent voter list under	174
section 3509.11 of the Revised Code;	175
(7) The voter's signature.	176
The registration form shall include a space on which the	177
person registering an applicant shall sign the person's name and	178
provide the person's address and a space on which the person	179
registering an applicant shall name the employer who is	180
employing that person to register the applicant.	181
The forms shall include a box for the person filling out	182
the form to check to indicate, if applicable, that the person	183
has filled out all or part of the form on behalf of the	184

applicant because the applicant declares that the applicant	185
requires such assistance by reason of blindness, disability, or	186
illiteracy.	187
Except for forms prescribed by the secretary of state	188
under section 3503.11 of the Revised Code, the secretary of	189
state shall permit boards of elections to produce forms that	190
have subdivided spaces for each individual alphanumeric	191
character of the information provided by the voter so as to	192
accommodate the electronic reading and conversion of the voter's	193
information to data and the subsequent electronic transfer of	194
that data to the statewide voter registration database	195
established under section 3503.15 of the Revised Code.	196
(B) None of the following persons who are registering an	197
applicant in the course of that official's or employee's normal	198
duties shall sign the person's name, provide the person's	199
address, or name the employer who is employing the person to	200
register an applicant on a form prepared under this section:	201
(1) An election official;	202
(2) A county treasurer;	203
(3) A deputy registrar of motor vehicles;	204
(4) An employee of a designated agency;	205
(5) An employee of a public high school;	206
(6) An employee of a public vocational school;	207
(7) An employee of a public library;	208
(8) An employee of the office of a county treasurer;	209
(9) An employee of the bureau of motor vehicles;	210
(10) An employee of a deputy registrar of motor vehicles;	211

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(11) An employee of an election official.	212
(C) Except as provided in section 3501.382 of the Revised	213
Code, any applicant who is unable to sign the applicant's own	214
name shall make an "X," if possible, which shall be certified by	215
the signing of the name of the applicant by the person filling	216
out the form, who shall add the person's own signature. If an	217
applicant is unable to make an "X," the applicant shall indicate	218
in some manner that the applicant desires to register to vote or	219
to change the applicant's name or residence. The person	220
registering the applicant shall sign the form and attest that	221
the applicant indicated that the applicant desired to register	222
to vote or to change the applicant's name or residence.	223
(D) No registration, change of residence, or change of	224
name form shall be rejected solely on the basis that a person	225
registering an applicant failed to sign the person's name or	226
failed to name the employer who is employing that person to	227
register the applicant as required under division (A) of this	228
section.	229
(E) A voter registration application submitted	230
electronically through the registrar of motor vehicles or a	231
deputy registrar pursuant to section 3503.11 or submitted online	232
through the internet pursuant to section 3503.20 of the Revised	233
Code is not required to contain a signature to be considered	234
valid. The signature obtained under division (A)(3) of section	235
3503.11 or under division (B) of section 3503.20 of the Revised	236
Code, as applicable, shall be considered the applicant's	237
signature for all election and signature-matching purposes.	238
(F) (1) Except as otherwise provided in division (C) of	239
this section and in sections 3501.382 and 3505.24 of the Revised	240
Code, no person shall preprint or fill out any portion of a	241

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voter registration, change of residence, or change of name form	242
on behalf of an applicant.	243
(2) A completed voter registration, change of residence,	244
or change of name form is not valid if any portion of it has	245
been completed by any person other than the applicant in	246
violation of division (F)(1) of this section.	247
(G) As used in this section, "registering an applicant"	248
includes any effort, for compensation, to provide voter	249
registration forms or to assist persons in completing or	250
returning those forms.	251
Sec. 3503.20. (A) The secretary of state shall establish a	252
secure online voter registration system. The system shall	253
provide for all of the following:	254
(1) An applicant to submit a voter registration	255
application to the secretary of state online through the	256
<pre>internet;</pre>	257
(2) The online applicant to be registered to vote, if all	258
of the following apply:	259
(a) The application contains all of the following	260
information:	261
(i) The applicant's name;	262
(ii) The applicant's address;	263
(iii) The applicant's date of birth;	264
(iv) The last four digits of the applicant's social	265
security number;	266
(v) The applicant's Ohio driver's license number or the	267
number of the applicant's state identification card issued under	268

section 4507.50 of the Revised Code.	269
(b) The applicant's name, address, and date of birth, the	270
last four digits of the applicant's social security number, and	271
the applicant's Ohio driver's license number or the number of	272
the applicant's state identification card as they are provided	273
in the application are not inconsistent with the information on	274
file with the bureau of motor vehicles;	275
(c) The applicant is a United States citizen, will have	276
lived in this state for thirty days immediately preceding the	277
next election, will be at least eighteen years of age on or	278
before the day of the next general election, and is otherwise	279
eligible to register to vote;	280
(d) The applicant attests to the truth and accuracy of the	281
information submitted in the online application under penalty of	282
election falsification.	283
(B) If an individual registers to vote or a registered	284
elector updates the elector's name, address, or both under this	285
section, the secretary of state shall obtain an electronic copy	286
of the applicant's or elector's signature that is on file with	287
the bureau of motor vehicles. That electronic signature shall be	288
used as the applicant's or elector's signature on voter	289
registration records, for all election and signature-matching	290
purposes.	291
(C) The secretary of state shall employ whatever security	292
measures the secretary of state considers necessary to ensure	293
the integrity and accuracy of voter registration information	294
submitted electronically pursuant to this section. Errors in	295
processing voter registration applications in the online system	296
shall not prevent an applicant from becoming registered or from	297

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voting.	298
(D) The online voter registration application under	299
division (A) of this section shall include the following	300
<pre>language:</pre>	301
"By clicking the box below, I request to be placed on the	302
permanent absent voter list under section 3509.11 of the Revised	303
<pre>Code."</pre>	304
In order to be placed on the permanent absent voter list	305
under this section, an applicant or elector shall be required to	306
mark the box in the online voter registration application that	307
appears in conjunction with the previous statement.	308
(E) The online voter registration application established	309
under division (A) of this section shall include the following	310
language:	311
"By clicking the box below, I affirm all of the following	312
under penalty of election falsification, which is a felony of	313
the fifth degree:	314
(1) I am the person whose name and identifying information	315
is provided on this form, and I desire to register to vote, or	316
update my voter registration, in the State of Ohio.	317
(2) All of the information I have provided on this form is	318
true and correct as of the date I am submitting this form.	319
(3) I am a United States citizen.	320
(4) I will have lived in Ohio for thirty days immediately	321
preceding the next election.	322
(5) I will be at least eighteen years of age on or before	323
the day of the next general election.	324

(6) I authorize the Bureau of Motor Vehicles to transmit	325
to the Ohio Secretary of State my signature that is on file with	326
the Bureau of Motor Vehicles, and I understand and agree that	327
the signature transmitted by the Bureau of Motor Vehicles will	328
be used by the Secretary of State to validate this electronic	329
voter registration application as if I had signed this form	330
personally."	331
In order to register to vote or update a voter	332
registration under division (A) of this section, an applicant or	333
elector shall be required to mark the box in the online voter	334
registration application that appears in conjunction with the	335
previous statement.	336
$\frac{(E)}{(F)}$ The online voter registration process established	337
under division (A) of this section shall be in operation and	338
available for use by individuals who wish to register to vote or	339
update their voter registration information online not earlier	340
than January 1, 2017. During the period beginning on the first	341
day after the close of voter registration before an election and	342
ending on the day of the election, the online voter registration	343
system shall display a notice indicating that the applicant will	344
not be registered to vote for the purposes of that election.	345
$\frac{(F)}{(G)}$ Notwithstanding section 1.50 of the Revised Code,	346
if any provision of this section or of division (E) of section	347
3503.14 of the Revised Code is held invalid, or if the	348
application of any provision of this section or of that division	349
to any person or circumstance is held invalid, then this section	350
and that division cease to operate.	351
Sec. 3503.28. (A) The secretary of state shall develop an	352
information brochure regarding voter registration. The brochure	353
shall include, but is not limited to, all of the following	354

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information:	355
(1) The applicable deadlines for registering to vote or	356
for returning an applicant's completed registration form;	357
(2) The applicable deadline for returning an applicant's	358
completed registration form if the person returning the form is	359
being compensated for registering voters;	360
(3) The locations to which a person may return an	361
applicant's completed registration form;	362
(4) The location to which a person who is compensated for	363
registering voters may return an applicant's completed	364
registration form;	365
(5) The registration and affirmation requirements	366
applicable to persons who are compensated for registering voters	367
under section 3503.29 of the Revised Code;	368
(6) A notice, which shall be written in bold type, stating	369
as follows:	370
"Voters must bring photo identification to the polls in	371
order to verify identity. Voters who do not provide photo	372
identification will still be able to vote by casting a	373
provisional ballot."	374
(7) The process to request to be placed on the permanent	375
absent voter list when completing a voter registration form.	376
(B) Except as otherwise provided in division (D) of this	377
section, a board of elections, designated agency, public high	378
school, public vocational school, public library, office of a	379
county treasurer, or deputy registrar of motor vehicles shall	380
distribute a copy of the brochure developed under division (A)	381
of this section to any person who requests more than two voter	382

registration forms at one time.	383
(C)(1) The secretary of state shall provide the	384
information required to be included in the brochure developed	385
under division (A) of this section to any person who prints a	386
voter registration form that is made available on a web site of	387
the office of the secretary of state.	388
(2) If a board of elections operates and maintains a web	389
site, the board shall provide the information required to be	390
included in the brochure developed under division (A) of this	391
section to any person who prints a voter registration form that	392
is made available on that web site.	393
(D) A board of elections shall not be required to	394
distribute a copy of a brochure under division (B) of this	395
section to any of the following officials or employees who are	396
requesting more than two voter registration forms at one time in	397
the course of the official's or employee's normal duties:	398
(1) An election official;	399
(2) A county treasurer;	400
(3) A deputy registrar of motor vehicles;	401
(4) An employee of a designated agency;	402
(5) An employee of a public high school;	403
(6) An employee of a public vocational school;	404
(7) An employee of a public library;	405
(8) An employee of the office of a county treasurer;	406
(9) An employee of the bureau of motor vehicles;	407
(10) An employee of a deputy registrar of motor vehicles;	408

(11) An employee of an election official.	409
(E) As used in this section, "registering voters" includes	410
any effort, for compensation, to provide voter registration	411
forms or to assist persons in completing or returning those	412

Sec. 3509.03. (A) Except as otherwise provided in sections	414
3509.051, 3511.02, and 3511.021 of the Revised Code, any	415
qualified elector desiring to vote absent voter's ballots at an	416
election shall deliver a written application for those ballots,	417
either in person or by mail, to the board of elections of the	418
county in which the elector's voting residence is located.	419
(B) Except as otherwise permitted under section 3511.02 of	420
the Revised Code and under division (C) of this section, the	421
application shall be on a form prescribed by the secretary of	422
state and shall contain all of the following:	423
(1) The elector's name;	424
(2) The elector's signature;	425
(3) The address at which the elector is registered to	426
vote;	427
(4) The elector's date of birth;	428
(5) One of the following:	429
(a) The elector's Ohio driver's license or state	430
identification card number;	431
(b) The last four digits of the elector's social security	432
number;	433
(c) A copy of the elector's photo identification.	434
(6) A statement identifying the election for which absent	435

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voter's ballots are requested;	436
(7) A statement that the person requesting the ballots is	437
a qualified elector;	438

(8) A box that the voter can mark in the affirmative to	439
request to be placed on the permanent absent voter list under	440
section 3509.11 of the Revised Code;	441
(9) If the request is for primary election ballots, the	442
elector's party affiliation;	443

elector, the address to which those ballots shall be mailed.	445
(C) If the elector has a confidential voter registration	446
record, as described in section 111.44 of the Revised Code, the	447
elector may provide the elector's program participant	448
identification number instead of the address at which the	449
elector is registered to vote.	450
(D) Except as otherwise provided in division (A) of	451
section 3509.051 and in division (B) of section 3509.08 of the	452
Revised Code, an application to receive absent voter's ballots	453
shall be delivered to the office of the board not earlier than	454
the first day of January of the year of the elections for which	455
the absent voter's ballots are requested or not earlier than	456
ninety days before the day of the election at which the ballots	457
are to be voted, whichever is earlier, and not later than the	458
close of business on the seventh day before the day of the	459
election at which the ballots are to be voted.	460
(E) Except as permitted under section 111.31 of the	461
Revised Code, no public office, and no public official or	462
employee who is acting in an official capacity, shall do either	463
of the following:	464

(1) Prepay the return postage for an application for	465
absent voter's ballots;	466
(2) Mail or otherwise deliver an unsolicited application	467
for absent voter's ballots to any person.	468
Tor absent voter's barrots to any person.	400
(F)(1) Except as otherwise provided in division (F)(2) of	469
this section and in sections 3505.24 and 3509.08 of the Revised	470
Code, no person shall preprint or fill out any portion of an	471
application for absent voter's ballots on behalf of an	472
applicant.	473
(2) The secretary of state or a board of elections may	474
preprint only an applicant's name and address on an application	475
for absent voter's ballots before mailing that application to	476
the applicant, except that if the applicant has a confidential	477
voter registration record, the secretary of state or a board of	478
elections shall not preprint the applicant's address on the	479
application.	480
(3) A completed application for absent voter's ballots is	481
not valid if any portion of it has been completed by any person	482
other than the applicant in violation of division (F) of this	483
section.	484
Sec. 3509.11. (A) An elector may request to be placed on	485
the permanent absent voter list maintained by boards of	486
elections in accordance with this section.	487
(B) A voter registration applicant or elector may request	488
to be placed on the permanent absent voter list by doing any of	489
the following:	490
(1) Completing a written application, prescribed by the	491
secretary of state, to be placed on the permanent absent voter	492
list and returning the completed application to the board of	493

elections of the county in which the elector is registered to	494
vote;	495
(2) Marking the box in the affirmative provided on a voter	496
registration form or change of name or change of address form	497
that indicates the applicant or elector wishes to be placed on	498
the permanent absent voter list;	499
(3) Checking the box provided when registering to vote or	500
updating the elector's voter registration on the online voter	501
registration system that indicates the applicant or elector	502
wishes to be placed on the permanent absent voter list;	503
(4) Marking the box provided on an application for an	504
absent voter's ballot that indicates the voter wishes to be	505
placed on the permanent absent voter list.	506
(C) An elector may be removed from the permanent absent	507
voter list if either of the following occur:	508
(1) The elector submits in writing, on a form prescribed	509
by the secretary of state, to the appropriate board of elections	510
a request to be removed from the permanent absent voter list.	511
(2) The elector's voter registration is canceled under	512
section 3503.21 of the Revised Code.	513
(D) Each board of elections shall mail an absent voter	514
ballot application for an election to each elector listed on the	515
board's permanent absent voter list not later than forty-five	516
days before the close of voter registration for that election.	517
An absent voter ballot application mailed under this section is	518
not considered an unsolicited application for absent voter's	519
ballots.	520
Section 2. That existing sections 3501.11, 3503.14,	521

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3503.20, 3503.28, and 3509.03 of the Revised Code are hereby	522
repealed.	523
