### A BILL

To establish certain child care grant programs, 1 including those related to child care capacity 2 and learning labs, and to make an appropriation. 3

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. All items in this act are hereby appropriated

as designated out of any moneys in the state treasury to the

5 credit of the designated fund. For all operating appropriations

made in this act, those in the first column are for fiscal year

2026 and those in the second column are for fiscal year 2027.

The operating appropriations made in this act are in addition to

any other operating appropriations made for these fiscal years.

	Under the program, any entity may apply	for a grant, bu	t,	27
in awarding grants, the Department of Children and Youth shall				28
give priority to the following applicant types: employers				29

tiered quality rating and improvement system. An applicant also shall submit a plan for ongoing sustainability to support its capacity expanding initiative and shall identify the needs and gaps its initiative would address.

Not more than \$750,000 shall be awarded to each grant recipient, and the recipient shall use the award only for the purposes described in this division.

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In addition, as part of the program and in an effort to aid business growth and recruitment in this state, the Department of Development, in coordination with JobsOhio and the Department of Children and Youth, shall create additional incentives for new or existing businesses to expand child care capacity or child care support for the state's workforce.

(B) (1) Of the foregoing appropriation item 830412, Child Care Grants, \$250,000 in each fiscal year shall be used by the Department of Children and Youth to contract with an entity to establish a cohort comprised of recipients of child care-related grants awarded by the Department, create an Employer-Based Child Care Co-Design Learning Lab, and develop tools and resources in order to train and support future child care grant applicants and other employers, government entities, or nonprofit organizations interested in expanding child care capacity.

(2) The entity selected shall coordinate education and knowledge-sharing among the grant recipients and cohorts, as well as provide technical assistance to these entities. The entity shall collaborate with grant recipients to collect and measure data, outcomes, and best practices, all as prescribed by the Department of Children and Youth. The entity shall prepare a report compiling the foregoing data, outcomes, and best practices and submit copies of it to the Department, Governor,

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and members of the General Assembly. The Department shall assist the entity in making the report available on the web site maintained by the Department.

- (3) The entity selected also shall establish an employer-71 based child care co-design learning lab program. The program's 72 aim shall be twofold: to assist employers, including businesses, 73 government entities, and nonprofit organizations, in learning 74 how to form partnerships and best fund, including by utilizing 75 tax credits, grants such as those available under this section, 76 77 and employer contributions and other opportunities as necessary 78 to create onsite or near-site child care spots or facilities and to identify other innovative strategies to expand child care 79 capacity in their communities. The program shall prioritize 80 rural and underserved areas of this state. Each design lab may 81 be regionally based and provide four to six months of intensive 82 learning to employer participants. Participants shall learn 8.3 processes and develop knowledge and competencies to plan, 84 organize, and find operations partners, to create long-term 8.5 financial modeling and business plans, to partner with community 86 stakeholders and organizations, and to apply for grants, 87 including those awarded by the Department. The program shall 88 emphasize the importance of operations partners, shall provide 89 participants with sample requests for proposals, and shall 90 encourage engagement with community and regional workforce 91 leadership. 92
- (4) Additionally, the entity selected shall design an employer tool kit and other resources as determined by the Department of Children and Youth, in consultation with JobsOhio and the Department of Development, that may be used to educate employers on issues impacting, and solutions improving, employee access to child care. The tool kit shall include, but not be

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limited to, all of the following topics:	99
