## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

<b>Section 1.</b> That sections 1751.84, 3923.84, 4783.01, and	8
4783.02 be amended and sections 3901.92 and 4783.40 of the	9
Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	10
Sec. 1751.84. (A) Notwithstanding section 3901.71 of the	11
Revised Code, each individual and group health insuring	12
corporation policy, contract, or agreement providing basic	13
health care services that is delivered, issued for delivery, or	14
renewed in this state shall provide coverage for the screening,	15
diagnosis, and treatment of autism spectrum disorder. A health	16
insuring corporation shall not terminate an individual's	17
coverage, or refuse to deliver, execute, issue, amend, adjust,	18
or renew coverage to an individual solely because the individual	19
is diagnosed with or has received treatment for an autism	20
spectrum disorder. Nothing in this section shall be applied to	21

nongrandfathered plans in the individual and small group markets	22
or to medicare supplement, accident-only, specified disease,	23
hospital indemnity, disability income, long-term care, or other	24
limited benefit hospital insurance policies. Except as otherwise	25
provided in division (B) of this section, coverage under this	26
section shall not be subject to dollar limits, deductibles, or	27
coinsurance provisions that are less favorable to an enrollee	28
than the dollar limits, deductibles, or coinsurance provisions	29
that apply to substantially all medical and surgical benefits	30
under the policy, contract, or agreement.	31
(B) Benefits provided under this section shall cover, at	32
minimum, all of the following:	33
(1) For speech Speech and language therapy or occupational	34
therapy <del>for an enrollee under the age of fourteen</del> -that is	35

holding a current, valid certificate issued under section	348
4783.04 of the Revised Code.	349
(B)(1)(B) "Exam-eligible technician" means an individual	350
who has met the requirements of division (B) of section 4783.40	351
of the Revised Code.	352
(C)(1) "Practice of applied behavior analysis" means the	353
design, implementation, and evaluation of instructional and	354
environmental modifications to produce socially significant	355
improvements in human behavior and includes the following:	356
(a) The empirical identification of functional relations	357
between behavior and environmental factors, known as functional	358
assessment and analysis;	359
(b) Interventions based on scientific research and the	360
direct observation and measurement of behavior and the	361
environment;	362
(c) Utilization of contextual factors, motivating	363
operations, antecedent stimuli, positive reinforcement, and	364

other consequences to help people develop new behaviors,	365
increase or decrease existing behaviors, and emit behaviors	366

(B) of this section and section 4783.40 of the Revised Code, no	374
person shall do either of the following:	375
(1) Engage in the practice of applied behavior analysis in	376
this state without holding a certificate issued under section	377
4783.04 of the Revised Code;	378
(2) Hold the person's self out to be a certified Ohio	379
behavior analyst unless the person holds a certificate issued	380
under section 4783.04 of the Revised Code.	381
(B) This chapter does not apply to any of the following:	382
(1) An individual licensed under Chapter 4732. of the	383

technician pursuant to this section, an individual must be	447
<pre>either of the following:</pre>	448
(1) The individual is in the process of becoming a	449
registered behavior technician certified by the behavior analyst	450
certification board and is practicing under the supervision of a	451

certified Ohio behavior analyst or a board certified assistant	452
behavior analyst holding a valid certification from the behavior	453
analyst certification board.	454
(2) The individual has satisfied all of the following	455
criteria:	456
(a) The individual holds a high school diploma or higher	457
degree.	458
(b) The individual has completed any equivalent coursework	459
or training requirements for registered behavior technicians	460

(C) An exam-eligible technician meeting the requirements	467
of this section may engage in the practice of applied behavior	468
analysis in this state under the supervision of a certified Ohio	469
behavior analyst for a period of ninety days after the date the	470
individual meets the requirements of division (B)(1) of this	471
section. If the individual does not achieve certification as a	472
certified Ohio behavior analyst by the end of that ninety-day	473
period, the individual is no longer eligible to engage in the	474
practice of applied behavior analysis as an exam-eligible	475
technician.	476

4783.01, and 4783.02 of the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	478
Section 3. PAYMENT RATES FOR ABA THERAPY SERVICES	479

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For fiscal year 2027, the Department of Medicaid shall	480
establish payment rates under the care management system	481
established under section 5167.03 of the Revised Code, for	482
applied behavior analysis therapy services used to treat	483
Medicaid enrollees with a diagnosis of autism spectrum disorder.	484
These payment rates shall equal one hundred per cent of the fee-	485
for-service rate for current procedural terminology codes 97151	486
through 97158.	487
