<u>(1) "Homeless shelter" has the same meaning as in section</u>	10
<u>2151.422 of the Revised Code.</u>	11
<u>(2) "Individual experiencing homelessness" has the same</u>	12
<u>meaning as in section 3705.243 of the Revised Code.</u>	13
<u>(3) "Nonprofit agency providing case management services</u>	14

(B) A homeless shelter or nonprofit agency providing case 17  
management services to individuals experiencing homelessness 18  
may, with consent, retain for an individual experiencing 19  
homelessness receiving services from the shelter or agency a 20  
physical or digital copy of the individual's social security 21  
card, certification of birth, or certified copy of a birth 22  
record. A shelter or agency that chooses to store a physical or 23  
digital copy of an individual experiencing homelessness' social 24  
security card, certification of birth, or certified copy of a 25  
birth record shall do both of the following: 26

(1) Retain possession of the physical or digital copy of 27  
the social security card, certification of birth, or certified 28  
copy of a birth record; 29

(2) Establish a mechanism to protect the physical or 30  
digital copy of a social security card, certification of birth, 31  
or certified copy of a birth record, including by ensuring that 32  
there is a physical or virtual lock protecting access to the 33  
copy and that the copy is only accessible to appropriate staff. 34

(C) An individual experiencing homelessness whose document 35  
is stored pursuant to division (B) of this section shall be 36  
permitted to access the document in a timely manner upon request 37  
and may request that the document be destroyed, deleted, or 38  
returned. A homeless shelter or nonprofit agency providing case 39  
management services to individuals experiencing homelessness 40  
shall destroy, delete, or return the document upon such a 41  
request." 42

Sec. 3705.50. (A) The director of health shall collect

information regarding the number of individuals experiencing 73  
homelessness for whom fees for a certification of birth, a 74  
certified copy of a birth record, or a replacement birth record 75  
were waived by the director of health or a person authorized by 76  
the director pursuant to section 3705.243 of the Revised Code. 77

(B) The director of health shall maintain the information 78  
submitted pursuant to sections 2101.166, 2303.202, 3705.243, and 79  
4507.50 of the Revised Code, compile it with the information 80  
collected under division (A) of this section, and submit an 81  
annual report to the general assembly in accordance with section 82  
101.68 of the Revised Code. The report shall detail the number 83  
of individuals experiencing homelessness for whom fees were 84  
waived in the preceding one-year period, delineated by type of 85  
document. The director shall make the report publicly available 86
