	4723.435 of the Revised Code to revise the law	5
	governing the practice of certified registered	6
	nurse anesthetists.	7

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4723.01, 4723.43, 4723.432,	8
4729.01, 4731.27, 4731.35, and 4761.17 be amended and new	9
section 4723.433 and section 4731.513 of the Revised Code be	10
enacted to read as follows:	11
Sec. 4723.01. As used in this chapter:	12
(A) "Registered nurse" means an individual who holds a	13
current, valid license issued under this chapter that authorizes	14
the practice of nursing as a registered nurse.	15
(B) "Practice of nursing as a registered nurse" means	16

providing to individuals and groups nursing care requiring	17
specialized knowledge, judgment, and skill derived from the	18
principles of biological, physical, behavioral, social, and	19
nursing sciences. Such nursing care includes:	20
(1) Identifying patterns of human responses to actual or	21
potential health problems amenable to a nursing regimen;	22
potential meater problems amenable to a narbing regimen,	22
(2) Executing a nursing regimen through the selection,	23
performance, management, and evaluation of nursing actions;	24
(3) Assessing health status for the purpose of providing	25
nursing care;	26
(4) Drawiding health counceling and health teaching.	27
(4) Providing health counseling and health teaching;	27
(5) Administering medications, treatments, and executing	28
regimens authorized by an individual who is authorized to	29
practice in this state and is acting within the course of the	30
individual's professional practice;	31
(6) Teaching, administering, supervising, delegating, and	32
evaluating nursing practice.	33
(C) "Nursing regimen" may include preventative,	34
restorative, and health-promotion activities.	35
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(D) "Assessing health status" means the collection of data	36
through nursing assessment techniques, which may include	37
interviews, observation, and physical evaluations for the	38
purpose of providing nursing care.	39
(E) "Licensed practical nurse" means an individual who	40
holds a current, valid license issued under this chapter that	41
authorizes the practice of nursing as a licensed practical	42
nurse.	43

(F) "The practice of nursing as a licensed practical	44
nurse" means providing to individuals and groups nursing care	45
requiring the application of basic knowledge of the biological,	46
physical, behavioral, social, and nursing sciences at the	47
direction of a registered nurse or any of the following who is	48
authorized to practice in this state: a physician, physician	49
assistant, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, or chiropractor.	50
Such nursing care includes:	51
(1) Observation, patient teaching, and care in a diversity	52
of health care settings;	53
(2) Contributions to the planning, implementation, and	54
evaluation of nursing;	55
(3) Administration of medications and treatments	56
authorized by an individual who is authorized to practice in	57
this state and is acting within the course of the individual's	58
<pre>professional practice;</pre>	59
(4) Administration to an adult of intravenous therapy	60
authorized by an individual who is authorized to practice in	61
this state and is acting within the course of the individual's	62
professional practice, on the condition that the licensed	63
practical nurse is authorized under section 4723.18 or 4723.181	64
of the Revised Code to perform intravenous therapy and performs	65
intravenous therapy only in accordance with those sections;	66
(5) Delegation of nursing tasks as directed by a	67
registered nurse;	68
(6) Teaching nursing tasks to licensed practical nurses	69
and individuals to whom the licensed practical nurse is	70
authorized to delegate nursing tasks as directed by a registered	71
nurse.	72

(G) "Certified registered nurse anesthetist" means an	73
advanced practice registered nurse who holds a current, valid	74
license issued under this chapter and is designated as a	75
certified registered nurse anesthetist in accordance with	76
section 4723.42 of the Revised Code and rules adopted by the	77
board of nursing.	78
(H) "Clinical nurse specialist" means an advanced practice	79
registered nurse who holds a current, valid license issued under	80
this chapter and is designated as a clinical nurse specialist in	81
accordance with section 4723.42 of the Revised Code and rules	82
adopted by the board of nursing.	83
(I) "Certified nurse-midwife" means an advanced practice	84
registered nurse who holds a current, valid license issued under	85
this chapter and is designated as a certified nurse-midwife in	86
accordance with section 4723.42 of the Revised Code and rules	87
adopted by the board of nursing.	88
(J) "Certified nurse practitioner" means an advanced	89
practice registered nurse who holds a current, valid license	90
issued under this chapter and is designated as a certified nurse	91
practitioner in accordance with section 4723.42 of the Revised	92
Code and rules adopted by the board of nursing.	93
(K) "Physician" means an individual authorized under	94
Chapter 4731. of the Revised Code to practice medicine and	95
surgery or osteopathic medicine and surgery.	96
(L) "Collaboration" or "collaborating" means the	97
following:	98
(1) In the case of a clinical nurse specialist or a	99
certified nurse practitioner, that one or more podiatrists	100
acting within the scope of practice of podiatry in accordance	101

with section 4731.51 of the Revised Code and with whom the nurse	102
has entered into a standard care arrangement or one or more	103
physicians with whom the nurse has entered into a standard care	104
arrangement are continuously available to communicate with the	105
clinical nurse specialist or certified nurse practitioner either	106
in person or by electronic communication;	107
(2) In the case of a certified nurse-midwife, that one or	108
more physicians with whom the certified nurse-midwife has	109
entered into a standard care arrangement are continuously	110
available to communicate with the certified nurse-midwife either	111
in person or by electronic communication.	112
(M) "Supervision," "Consultation" or "consulting," as it	113
pertains to a certified registered nurse anesthetist, means that	114
the certified registered nurse anesthetist is under the	115
direction of a podiatrist acting within the podiatrist's scope	116
of practice in accordance with section 4731.51 of the Revised	117
Code, a dentist acting within the dentist's scope of practice in	118
accordance with Chapter 4715. of the Revised Code, or a	119
physician, and, when administering anesthesia, the certified	120
registered nurse anesthetist is in the immediate presence of the	121
podiatrist, a dentist who holds a conscious sedation or general	122
anesthesia permit as described in section 4715.03 of the Revised	123
Code, or physician, or podiatrist, in accordance with policies	124
established by the setting where the nurse and dentist,	125
physician, or podiatrist practice, has requested, either	126
verbally or in writing, the nurse to perform for a patient any	127
of the nursing care activities authorized by division (D) of	128
section 4723.43 of the Revised Code.	129
(N) "Standard care arrangement" means a written, formal	130

guide for planning and evaluating a patient's health care that

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is developed by one or more collaborating physicians or	132
podiatrists and a clinical nurse specialist, certified nurse-	133
midwife, or certified nurse practitioner and meets the	134
requirements of section 4723.431 of the Revised Code.	135
(O) "Advanced practice registered nurse" means an	136
individual who holds a current, valid license issued under this	137
chapter that authorizes the practice of nursing as an advanced	138
practice registered nurse and is designated as any of the	139
following:	140
(1) A certified registered nurse anesthetist;	141
(2) A clinical nurse specialist;	142
(3) A certified nurse-midwife;	143
(4) A certified nurse practitioner.	144
(P) "Practice of nursing as an advanced practice	145
registered nurse" means providing to individuals and groups	146
nursing care that requires knowledge and skill obtained from	147
advanced formal education, training, and clinical experience.	148
Such nursing care includes the care described in section 4723.43	149
of the Revised Code.	150
(Q) "Dialysis care" means the care and procedures that a	151
dialysis technician or dialysis technician intern is authorized	152
to provide and perform, as specified in section 4723.72 of the	153
Revised Code.	154
(R) "Dialysis technician" means an individual who holds a	155
current, valid certificate to practice as a dialysis technician	156
issued under section 4723.75 of the Revised Code.	157
(S) "Dialysis technician intern" means an individual who	158
has not passed the dialysis technician certification examination	159

required by section 4723.751 of the Revised Code, but who has	160
successfully completed a dialysis training program approved by	161
the board of nursing under section 4723.74 of the Revised Code	162
within the previous eighteen months.	163
(T) "Certified community health worker" means an	164
individual who holds a current, valid certificate as a community	165
health worker issued under section 4723.85 of the Revised Code.	166
(U) "Medication aide" means an individual who holds a	167
current, valid certificate issued under this chapter that	168
authorizes the individual to administer medication in accordance	169
with section 4723.67 of the Revised Code \div .	170
(V) "Nursing specialty" means a specialty in practice as a	171
certified registered nurse anesthetist, clinical nurse	172
specialist, certified nurse-midwife, or certified nurse	173
practitioner.	174
(W) "Physician assistant" means an individual who is	175
licensed to practice as a physician assistant under Chapter	176
4730. of the Revised Code.	177
(X) "Podiatrist" means an individual authorized under	178
Chapter 4731. of the Revised Code to practice podiatric medicine	179
and surgery.	180
(Y) "Dentist" means an individual who is licensed to	181
practice dentistry under Chapter 4715. of the Revised Code.	182
Sec. 4723.43. A certified registered nurse anesthetist,	183
clinical nurse specialist, certified nurse-midwife, or certified	184
nurse practitioner, clinical nurse specialist, or certified	185
registered nurse anesthetist may provide to individuals and	186
groups nursing care that requires knowledge and skill obtained	187
from advanced formal education and clinical experience. In this	188

capacity as an advanced practice registered nurse, a certified	189

clinical nurse specialist may, in collaboration with one or more	262
physicians or podiatrists, prescribe drugs and therapeutic	263
devices in accordance with section 4723.481 of the Revised Code.	264
When a clinical nurse specialist is collaborating with a	265
podiatrist, the nurse's scope of practice is limited to the	266
procedures that the podiatrist has the authority under section	267
4731.51 of the Revised Code to perform.	268
(D) A nurse authorized to practice as a certified	269
registered nurse anesthetist, in consultation with a physician,	270
podiatrist, or dentist actively engaged in practice in this	271
state, may perform for a patient any of the following nursing	272
care activities, consistent with the nurse's education and	273
certification, and in accordance with rules adopted by the board	274
and policies established by the setting where the nurse and	275
<pre>consulting physician, podiatrist, or dentist practice:</pre>	276
(1) Obtaining informed consent for anesthesia care and	277

performing preanesthetic preparation and evaluation;	278
(2) Administering anesthesia, by performing anesthesia	279
induction, maintenance, and emergence;	280
(3) Performing epidural or spinal anesthetic procedures;	281
(4) Performing postanesthetic preparation and evaluation	282
and providing postanesthesia care;	283
(5) Performing clinical support functions;	284
(6) As necessary for patient management and care,	285
selecting, ordering, and administering treatments, drugs, and	286
intravenous fluids for conditions related to either the	287
administration of anesthesia or the performance of clinical	288
<pre>support functions;</pre>	289
(7) Performing and documenting evaluations and	290
assessments, which may include ordering and evaluating one or	291
more diagnostic tests for conditions related to the	292
administration of anesthesia or the performance of clinical	293
<pre>support functions;</pre>	294
(8) Directing a registered nurse, licensed practical	295
nurse, or respiratory therapist to do the following, but only if	296
the nurse or therapist is authorized by law to do so:	297
(a) Provide supportive care, with such care to include	298
monitoring vital signs, conducting electrocardiograms, and	299
administering intravenous fluids;	300
(b) Administer treatments, drugs, and intravenous fluids	301
for conditions related to either the administration of	302
anesthesia or the performance of clinical support functions.	303
When a certified registered nurse anesthetist consults	304

with a dentist, the nurse's scope of practice is limited to the	305
anesthesia procedures that the dentist has the authority to	306
perform under the dentist's conscious sedation or general	307
anesthesia permit issued under Chapter 4715. of the Revised	308
Code.	309
Division (D) of this section does not authorize a	310
certified registered nurse anesthetist to prescribe a drug for	311
use outside of the setting where the nurse practices.	312
Sec. 4723.432. (A) An advanced practice registered nurse	313
who is designated as a clinical nurse specialist, certified	314
nurse-midwife, or certified nurse practitioner shall cooperate	315
with the state medical board in any investigation the board	316

anesthetist shall not engage in one or more of the nursing care	335
activities described in division (D) of section 4723.43 of the	336

not in the patient's best interest for the nurse to perform such	338
an activity or activities:	339
(1) The nurse's consulting physician, podiatrist, or	340
<pre>dentist;</pre>	341
(2) The setting where the nurse and physician, podiatrist,	342
or dentist practice.	343
If a consulting physician, podiatrist, or dentist or	344
setting makes such a determination, the patient's medical or	345
electronic health record shall indicate that the nurse is	346
prohibited from performing the activity or activities.	347
(B) If a certified registered nurse anesthetist performs	348
one or more of the activities described in division (D) of	349
section 4723.43 of the Revised Code, the nurse shall so indicate	350
in the patient's medical or electronic health record.	351
(C) This section does not prohibit a certified registered	352
nurse anesthetist from implementing a verbal order issued by a	353
consulting physician, podiatrist, or dentist.	354
Sec. 4729.01. As used in this chapter:	355
(A) "Pharmacy," except when used in a context that refers	356
to the practice of pharmacy, means any area, room, rooms, place	357
of business, department, or portion of any of the foregoing	358
where the practice of pharmacy is conducted.	359
(B) "Practice of pharmacy" means providing pharmacist care	360
requiring specialized knowledge, judgment, and skill derived	361

from the principles of biological, chemical, behavioral, social,	362
pharmaceutical, and clinical sciences. As used in this division,	363
"pharmacist care" includes the following:	364
(1) Interpreting prescriptions;	365
(2) Dispensing drugs and drug therapy related devices;	366
(3) Compounding drugs;	367
(4) Counseling individuals with regard to their drug	368
therapy, recommending drug therapy related devices, and	369
assisting in the selection of drugs and appliances for treatment	370
of common diseases and injuries and providing instruction in the	371
proper use of the drugs and appliances;	372
(5) Performing drug regimen reviews with individuals by	373
discussing all of the drugs that the individual is taking and	374
explaining the interactions of the drugs;	375
(6) Performing drug utilization reviews with licensed	376
health professionals authorized to prescribe drugs when the	377
pharmacist determines that an individual with a prescription has	378
a drug regimen that warrants additional discussion with the	379
<pre>prescriber;</pre>	380
(7) Advising an individual and the health care	381
professionals treating an individual with regard to the	382
<pre>individual's drug therapy;</pre>	383
(8) Acting pursuant to a consult agreement, if an	384
agreement has been established;	385
(9) Engaging in the administration of immunizations to the	386
extent authorized by section 4729.41 of the Revised Code;	387
(10) Engaging in the administration of drugs to the extent	388

authorized by section 4729.45 of the Revised Code.	389
(C) "Compounding" means the preparation, mixing,	390
assembling, packaging, and labeling of one or more drugs in any	391
of the following circumstances:	392
(1) Pursuant to a prescription issued by a licensed health	393
professional authorized to prescribe drugs;	394
(2) Pursuant to the modification of a prescription made in	395
accordance with a consult agreement;	396
(3) As an incident to research, teaching activities, or	397
chemical analysis;	398
(4) In anticipation of orders for drugs pursuant to	399
prescriptions, based on routine, regularly observed dispensing	400
patterns;	401
(5) Pursuant to a request made by a licensed health	402
professional authorized to prescribe drugs for a drug that is to	403
be used by the professional for the purpose of direct	404
administration to patients in the course of the professional's	405
practice, if all of the following apply:	406
(a) At the time the request is made, the drug is not	407
commercially available regardless of the reason that the drug is	408
not available, including the absence of a manufacturer for the	409
drug or the lack of a readily available supply of the drug from	410
a manufacturer.	411
(b) A limited quantity of the drug is compounded and	412
provided to the professional.	413
(c) The drug is compounded and provided to the	414
professional as an occasional exception to the normal practice	415
of dispensing drugs pursuant to patient-specific prescriptions.	416

(D) "Consult agreement" means an agreement that has been	417
entered into under section 4729.39 of the Revised Code.	418
(E) "Drug" means:	419
(1) Any article recognized in the United States	420
pharmacopoeia and national formulary, or any supplement to them,	421
intended for use in the diagnosis, cure, mitigation, treatment,	422
or prevention of disease in humans or animals;	423
(2) Any other article intended for use in the diagnosis,	424
cure, mitigation, treatment, or prevention of disease in humans	425
or animals;	426
(3) Any article, other than food, intended to affect the	427
structure or any function of the body of humans or animals;	428
(4) Any article intended for use as a component of any	429
article specified in division $(E)(1)$, (2) , or (3) of this	430
section; but does not include devices or their components,	431
parts, or accessories.	432
"Drug" does not include "hemp" or a "hemp product" as	433
those terms are defined in section 928.01 of the Revised Code.	434
(F) "Dangerous drug" means any of the following:	435
(1) Any drug to which either of the following applies:	436
(a) Under the "Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act," 52	437
Stat. 1040 (1938), 21 U.S.C.A. 301, as amended, the drug is	438
required to bear a label containing the legend "Caution: Federal	439
law prohibits dispensing without prescription" or "Caution:	440
Federal law restricts this drug to use by or on the order of a	441
licensed veterinarian" or any similar restrictive statement, or	442
the drug may be dispensed only upon a prescription;	443

(b) Under Chapter 3715. or 3719. of the Revised Code, the	444
drug may be dispensed only upon a prescription.	445
(2) Any drug that contains a schedule V controlled	446
substance and that is exempt from Chapter 3719. of the Revised	447
Code or to which that chapter does not apply;	448
(3) Any drug intended for administration by injection into	449
the human body other than through a natural orifice of the human	450
body;	451
(4) Any drug that is a biological product, as defined in	452
section 3715.01 of the Revised Code.	453
(G) "Federal drug abuse control laws" has the same meaning	454
as in section 3719.01 of the Revised Code.	455
(H) "Prescription" means all of the following:	456
(1) A written, electronic, or oral order for drugs or	457
combinations or mixtures of drugs to be used by a particular	458
individual or for treating a particular animal, issued by a	459
licensed health professional authorized to prescribe drugs;	460
(2) For purposes of sections 4723.4810, 4729.282,	461
