BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	5
4503.966 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	6
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	7
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	8
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid	9
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of	10
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced	11
in division (B) of this section.	12
(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the	13

Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.
