## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 1517.14 of the Revised Code be	4
amended to read as follows:	5
Sec. 1517.14. (A) The—Subject to division (C)(4) of this	6
section, the director of natural resources may create wild,	7
scenic, and recreational rivers. The chief of the division of	8
natural areas and preserves shall supervise, operate, protect,	9
and maintain wild, scenic, and recreational rivers so created.	10
In creating wild, scenic, and recreational rivers, the director	11
shall classify each such watercourse as either a wild river, a	12
scenic river, or a recreational river. The chief may prepare and	13
maintain a plan for the establishment, development, use, and	14
administration of those rivers as a part of the comprehensive	15
state plans for water management and outdoor recreation. The	16
chief, with the approval of the director, may cooperate with	17
federal agencies administering any federal program concerning	18
wild, scenic, or recreational river systems.	19
(B) The director may propose to create a wild, scenic, or	20

recreational river that consists of a part or parts of any	21
watercourse in this state that in the director's judgment	22
possesses water conservation, scenic, fish, wildlife, historic,	23
or outdoor recreation values that should be preserved.	24
(C)(1) The director shall publish the intention to declare	25
a watercourse a wild, scenic, or recreational river at least	26
once in a newspaper of general circulation in each county, any	27
part through which the watercourse flows. The director also	28
shall send written notice of the intention to the legislative	29
authority of each county, township, and municipal corporation	30
and to each conservancy district established under Chapter 6101.	31
of the Revised Code, any part through which the watercourse	32
flows, and to the director of transportation, the director of	33
development, the director of administrative services, and the	34
director of environmental protection. The notices shall include	35
a copy of a map and description of the watercourse to be	36
designated.	37
(2) The director of natural resources shall post the	38
intention to declare a watercourse a wild, scenic, or	39
recreational river on the division of natural areas and	40
preserves' web site on the date of the initial publication under	41
division (C)(1) of this section.	42
(3) Any person having an interest in the proposed	43
declaration may file written comments to the proposal within	44
sixty days of the last date of publication or dispatch of	45
written notice as required under division (C)(1) of this	46
section. The director shall post on the division's web site the	47
last date by which written comments may be filed.	48
(4) Not later than forty-five days after the last date of	49

publication or dispatch of written notice as required under\_

division (C)(1) of this section, each board of county	51
commissioners having jurisdiction over any part through which	52
the watercourse flows may adopt a resolution to disapprove of	53
the designation of a scenic river. The board may adopt such	54
resolution at a regular meeting of the board or at a special	55
meeting called for the purpose of discussing such a resolution.	56
At least thirty days prior to the meeting at which a resolution	57
to disapprove a scenic river designation will be discussed, the	58
board shall provide public notice of the date and time of the	59
meeting by one publication in a newspaper of general circulation	60
within the county.	61
If any board adopts such a resolution, the board, in	62
writing, shall notify the director of the resolution. Such	63
notification shall be submitted within sixty days of the last	64
date of publication or dispatch of written notice as required	65
under division (C)(1) of this section. If the director receives	66
such notification, the director shall not designate such	67
watercourse as a scenic river.	68
(5) After sixty days from the last date of publication or	69
dispatch of written notice as required under division (C)(1) of	70
this section and subject to division (C)(4) of this section, the	71
director may enter a declaration in the director's journal that	72
the watercourse is a wild river, scenic river, or recreational	73
river. When so entered, the watercourse is a wild, scenic, or	74
recreational river, as applicable. The director, after sixty	75
days' notice as prescribed in this section, may terminate the	76
status of a watercourse as a wild river, scenic river, or	77
recreational river by an entry in the director's journal.	78
(D) Declaration of a watercourse as a wild, scenic, or	79

recreational river does not do either of the following:

(1) Affect private property rights or authorize the	81	
director, chief of the division of natural areas and preserves,	82	
or any governmental agency or political subdivision to restrict		
the use of private land adjacent to the river or to enter upon		
<pre>private land;</pre>	85	
(2) Expand or abridge the regulatory authority of any	86	
governmental agency or political subdivision over the river.	87	
(E) The director may acquire real property or any estate,	88	
right, or interest therein in order to provide for the	89	
protection and public recreational use of a wild, scenic, or	90	
recreational river. The director may enter into a lease or other	91	
agreement with a political subdivision to administer all or part	92	
of any publicly owned land that is administered by the division	93	
and that is within the watershed of a wild, scenic, or	94	
recreational river.	95	
(F) A wild, scenic, or recreational river that was	96	
declared as such by the director of natural resources under	97	
Chapter 1547. of the Revised Code prior to the effective date of	98	
this amendment October 24, 2024, retains its declaration as a	99	
wild, scenic, or recreational river for purposes of sections	100	
1517.14 to 1517.19 of the Revised Code on and after that date.	101	
Section 2. That existing section 1517.14 of the Revised	102	
Code is hereby repealed.	103	
Section 3. (A) Not later than ninety days after the	104	
effective date of this section, any board of county	105	
commissioners having jurisdiction over any part of a watercourse	106	
that was designated as a scenic river on or after November 1,	107	
2024, may adopt a resolution to disapprove of such designation.	108	
The board may adopt such resolution at a regular meeting of the	109

board or at a special meeting called for the purpose of		
discussing such a resolution. At least thirty days prior to the		
meeting at which a resolution to disapprove a scenic river		
designation will be discussed, the board shall provide public		
notice of the date and time of the meeting by one publication in		
a newspaper of general circulation within the county.		
(B) If any board adopts such a resolution, the board shall	116	
so notify the Director of Natural Resources. The Director shall,	117	
in accordance with the procedures established in section 1517.14		
of the Revised Code, terminate the status of such watercourse as	119	
a scenic river.
