\_\_\_\_\_ moved to amend as follows:

After line 306, insert:

"(3) (a) Except as provided in division (C) (3) (b) of this section, the department shall allow each provider participating in the automated child care system and each caretaker parent to backdate a child's attendance record only within seven calendar days of the date that publicly funded child care was provided.

(b) The department may grant approval to the provider or caretaker parent to backdate a child's attendance record within thirty days of the date that publicly funded child care was provided or scheduled to be provided if the backdating relates to either of the following:

(i) A documented emergency or extenuating circumstance beyond the provider's or caretaker parent's control, such as a system outage, natural disaster, or other serious event as the department determines;

(ii) The thirty-day period described in division (L) of section 5104.38 of the Revised Code."
