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To create the Artificial Intelligence Study	1
Commission to study and make recommendations	2
regarding the use of artificial intelligence in	3
state and local government.	4

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

<b>Section 1.</b> (A) The Artificial Intelligence Study	5
Commission is created. The Commission shall do all of the	6
following:	7
(1) Review current state and local government approaches	8
to oversight and regulation of artificial intelligence;	9
(2) Not later than December 31, 2028, issue a report of	10
its findings and recommendations to the Governor, the President	11
and Minority Leader of the Senate, and the Speaker and Minority	12
Leader of the House of Representatives, including both of the	13
following:	14
(a) A review of state and local government use of	15
artificial intelligence in this state;	16
(b) Recommendations for a comprehensive regulatory	17

framework regarding the use of artificial intelligence in this 18  
state. 19

(B) The Commission may hold hearings regarding legislation 20  
pending in the House of Representatives and the Senate and 21  
provide recommendations to the members of each chamber. 22

(C) The Commission shall consist of the following members: 23

(1) The State Chief Information Officer, who shall serve 24  
as a co-chair of the Commission; 25

(2) The Director of Commerce, who shall serve as a co- 26  
chair of the Commission; 27

(3) One member from the private sector with significant 28  
experience in the development or application of artificial 29  
intelligence technologies appointed by the Governor; 30

(4) One member with expertise in energy or other critical 31  
infrastructure systems appointed by the Governor; 32

(5) One member from institutions of higher education with 33  
demonstrated expertise in artificial intelligence appointed by 34  
the Governor; 35

(6) One member from the Department of Public Safety 36  
appointed by the Director of Public Safety; 37

(7) One member from the K-12 education community appointed 38  
by the Director of Education and Workforce; 39

(8) One member from a local workforce development board 40  
appointed by the Governor; 41

(9) One member representing the interests of consumers 42  
appointed by the Governor; 43

(10) One member from local government appointed by the 44

Governor; 45

(11) One member from the Department of Agriculture 46  
appointed by the Director of Agriculture; 47

(12) Four members of the General Assembly, two members 48  
from the majority party appointed by the Speaker of the House 49  
and the President of the Senate, and two members from the 50  
minority party appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of 51  
Representatives and Minority Leader of the Senate. 52

(D) (1) All members of the Commission are voting members. 53

(2) Each appointed member of the Commission serves at the 54  
pleasure of the member's appointing authority. 55

(3) The appointing authorities shall appoint all appointed 56  
members of the Commission before the Commission's first meeting. 57

(4) Any vacancy in the Commission shall be filled in the 58  
same manner as the original appointment. 59

(5) Members of the Commission shall serve without 60  
compensation. 61

(E) (1) The Commission shall hold its initial meeting at 62  
the call of the Governor, not later than January 30, 2027. 63

(2) All subsequent meetings of the Commission shall be 64  
held at the call of the co-chairpersons. The Commission shall 65  
meet on a quarterly basis, or more often, at the discretion of 66  
the co-chairpersons. 67

(F) The staff of the House of Representatives, the Senate, 68  
Department of Administrative Services, and the Department of 69  
Commerce shall provide technical and administrative support as 70  
needed by the Commission. 71

(G) The Commission ceases to exist on January 1, 2029.

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
