To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1  
4503.897 of the Revised Code to create the "Dr. 2  
Martin Luther King, Jr." license plate. 3

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That section 4501.21 be amended and section 4  
4503.897 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 5

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 6  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 7  
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 8  
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 9  
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 10  
in division (B) of this section. 11

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 12  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 13

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 14  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 15  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 16  
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 17

cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 18  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 19  
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 20  
other abortion-related activities. 21

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 22  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 23  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 24  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 25  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 26  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 27  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 28  
other money in that fund. 29

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 30  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 31  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 32  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 33

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 34  
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 35  
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 36  
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 37  
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 38  
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 39  
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 40  
directly to their clients. 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 42  
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 43  
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 44  
it receives under this section to assist those who have 45  
pancreatic cancer and their families. 46

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund research for the cure of childhood cancers.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4912 of the Revised Code to

the Ben Morrison memorial fund, which shall use the 76  
contributions for scholarships and other programs that support 77  
mental health. 78

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 79  
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 80  
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 81  
contributions into its general account to be used for 82  
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 83  
America foundation. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 85  
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 86  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 87  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 88  
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 89

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 90  
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 91  
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 92  
scholarships and other educational activities. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 94  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 95  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 96  
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 97  
that organization. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 99  
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 100  
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 101  
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 102  
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 103

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 104

pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational programming.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in need.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the Ohio chapters of a kid again.

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the university or college whose name or marking or design appears on collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that section. A university or college that receives contributions from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general scholarship fund.

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.512 of the Revised Code to the Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Incorporated Delta Theta Omega chapter in Ohio. The Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Incorporated Delta Theta Omega chapter shall use the contributions for the development and perpetuation of scholarship, leadership, citizenship, fidelity, and brotherhood among men and youth in this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 134  
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 135  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 136  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 137  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 138  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 139  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 140  
funds as provided in this section. 141

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 142  
receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 143  
Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 144  
of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 145  
attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 146  
funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 147  
program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 148  
with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 149  
funds as provided in this section. 150

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 151  
receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 152  
university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 153  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 154  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 155  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 156  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 157  
university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 158  
funds as provided in this section. 159

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 160  
receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 161  
Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 162  
contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 163

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen advocates for addiction recovery).

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.520 of the Revised Code to Purdue university in West Lafayette, Indiana, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with Purdue university to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio cyclists of all ages.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws of this state, to assist that organization in paying the expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, educational, and cultural events at the monument.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the

lighthouses of fairport harbor. 194

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 195  
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 196  
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 197  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 198  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 199

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 200  
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 201  
United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 202  
distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 203  
States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 204  
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 205  
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 206  
sponsors within this state. 207

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 208  
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 209  
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 210  
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 211  
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 212  
activities. 213

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 214  
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 215  
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 216  
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 217  
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 218  
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 219

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 220  
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 221  
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 222

receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 223  
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 224  
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 225  
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 226  
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 227  
the improvement of patient outcomes. 228

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 229  
receives pursuant to section 4503.53 of the Revised Code to the 230  
Indiana Kentucky Ohio regional council of carpenters. The 231  
council shall use the money it receives to assist its members 232  
who are experiencing financial hardship. 233

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 234  
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 235  
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 236  
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 237  
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 238  
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 239  
personnel, veterans, and their families. 240

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 241  
receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the 242  
Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for 243  
the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house. 244

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 245  
receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the 246  
nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry 247  
health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to 248  
further the nonprofit's mission. 249

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 250  
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 251

disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 252  
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 253  
families. 254

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 255  
receives pursuant to section 4503.536 of the Revised Code to 256  
save a warrior, incorporated, which shall use the contributions 257  
to prevent suicide by active members of the armed forces of the 258  
United States, veterans of those armed forces, and first 259  
responders. 260

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 261  
receives pursuant to section 4503.542 of the Revised Code to the 262  
Ohio craft brewers association. 263

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 264  
receives pursuant to section 4503.541 of the Revised Code to 265  
Dolly Parton's imagination library of Ohio. The library shall 266  
use the money it receives under this section for operational 267  
costs, including the distribution of books. 268

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 269  
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 270  
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 271  
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 272  
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 273

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 274  
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 275  
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 276  
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 277  
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 278  
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 279  
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 280

destination. 281

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 282  
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 283  
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 284  
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 285  
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 286  
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 287  
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 288  
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 289  
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 290  
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 291  
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 292

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 293  
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 294  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 295

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 296  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 297  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 298  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 299  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 300  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 301  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 302  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 303  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 304  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 305  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 306  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 307  
under this section. 308

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 309  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 310

Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 311  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 312  
programs. 313

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 314  
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 315  
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 316  
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 317

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 318  
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 319  
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 320  
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 321  
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 322

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 323  
receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 324  
central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 325  
which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 326  
Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 327  
the person who paid the contribution resides. 328

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 329  
receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to 330  
playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use 331  
the contributions to further its mission of presenting and 332  
producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing 333  
arts education, and creating a superior destination for 334  
entertainment, business, and residential living. 335

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 336  
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 337  
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 338  
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 339

establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 340  
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 341  
ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 342  
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 343  
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 344  
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 345  
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 346  
such payments are to be made. 347

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 348  
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 349  
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 350  
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 351  
river watershed. 352

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 353  
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 354  
Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 355  
nature preserve. 356

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 357  
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 358  
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 359  
the money in support of the park. 360

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 361  
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 362  
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 363  
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 364

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 365  
receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 366  
girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 367  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 368

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.569 of the Revised Code to the Ohio bird sanctuary, located in Mansfield, Ohio, which shall use the contributions for purposes of its operations, bird care and rehabilitation, and educational programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational information about beekeeping, and to support other state and local beekeeping programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace legends to inspire future leaders.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities to take greater responsibility for improving the local environment through litter prevention, beautification, community greening, waste reduction, and recycling.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state coalition-national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use the contributions for educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 398  
Ohio past detachment commander's club, inc., which shall use the 399  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 400

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 401  
receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the 402  
progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which 403  
shall use the contributions to support the activities of the 404  
center. 405

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 406  
receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the 407  
American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the 408  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 409

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 410  
receives, or has received, pursuant to section 4503.584 of the 411  
Revised Code to the Ohio natural energy foundation to fund 412  
scholarships for students pursuing careers in the oil and 413  
natural gas industry. 414

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 415  
receives pursuant to section 4503.585 of the Revised Code to the 416  
Terrace Park recreation committee, inc. to offer scholarships to 417  
young athletes of, and maintain athletic facilities in, the 418  
municipal corporation of Terrace Park. 419

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 420  
receives pursuant to section 4503.586 of the Revised Code to the 421  
Ohio mountain bike alliance. 422

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 423  
receives pursuant to section 4503.588 of the Revised Code to the 424  
Ohio grange patrons of husbandry foundation, which shall use the 425  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 426

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 427  
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 428  
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 429  
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 430  
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 431  
commission and that is participating in the license plate 432  
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 433  
of the county of residence of an applicant. 434

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 435  
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 436  
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 437  
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 438  
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 439  
(G) of that section. 440

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 441  
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 442  
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 443  
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 444  
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 445  
Ohio and for educational programs. 446

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 447  
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 448  
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 449  
supporting cancer research. 450

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 451  
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 452  
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 453

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 454  
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 455

Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 456

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 457  
receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 458  
Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 459  
contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 460  
pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 461

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 462  
receives pursuant to section 4503.598 of the Revised Code 463  
equally to the Jackson local schools foundation and the Jackson 464  
high school alumni association. The foundation and alumni 465  
association shall use the contributions for the foundation's and 466  
alumni association's purposes. 467

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 468  
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 469  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 470  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 471  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 472

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 473  
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 474  
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 475  
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 476  
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 477  
scouts. 478

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 479  
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 480  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 481  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 482  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 483

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 484

receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 485  
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 486  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 487

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 488  
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 489  
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 490  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 491

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 492  
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 493  
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 494  
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 495  
charitable purposes. 496

high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1299  
purpose. 1300

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1301

contributions to fund college and career technical training 1304  
scholarships for students. 1305

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1306

and issuance of "Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr." license plates. 1334  
The application may be combined with a request for a special 1335

compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this 1338  
section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the 1339  
appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Dr. Martin Luther 1340  
King, Jr." license plates and a validation sticker, or a 1341  
validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of 1342  
the Revised Code. 1343

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1344  
inscribed on the license plates, "Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr." 1345  
license plates shall display an appropriate logo and words that 1346  
are selected by representatives of the King arts complex, in 1347  
consultation with the Ohio Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday 1348  
commission, and approved by the registrar. "Dr. Martin Luther 1349  
King, Jr." license plates shall display county identification 1350  
stickers that identify the county of registration as required 1351

(B) "Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr." license plates and a 1353

validation sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued 1354  
upon receipt of an application for registration of a motor 1355  
vehicle under this section; payment of the regular license tax 1356  
as prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any 1357  
applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. 1358  
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by 1359  
section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional 1360  
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as 1361  
provided in division (C) (1) of this section; and compliance with 1362  
all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor 1363  
vehicles. 1364

(C) (1) Notwithstanding section 4503.79 of the Revised 1365  
Code, for each application for registration and registration 1366  
renewal notice the registrar receives under this section, the 1367  
registrar shall notify the applicant that the applicant may 1368  
provide a contribution of an amount determined by the applicant. 1369  
If the applicant provides a contribution to the registrar, the 1370  
registrar shall accept the contribution amount provided by the 1371  
applicant and deposit the contribution into the state treasury 1372  
to the credit of the license plate contribution fund created in 1373  
section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. If the applicant does not 1374  
provide a contribution, the registrar shall not reject an 1375  
application submitted under this section. 1376

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1377  
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 1378  
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 1379  
of "Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr." license plates, into the state 1380  
treasury to the credit of the public safety - highway purposes 1381  
fund created in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 1382
