To establish the Social Work Apprenticeship	1
Retention and Training (SMART) Internship	2
Program, to name this act the Ohio Students and	3
Families Workforce Strengthening Act, and to	4
make an appropriation.	5

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. (A) As used in this section:	6
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(1) "Eligible student" means a student who is both of the	7
following:	8

(a) Enrolled in, and in good standing at, a master's	9
degree program at one of the following:	10

(i) Bowling Green State University;	11
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(ii) Miami University;	12
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(iii) Ohio University;	13
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(iv) Wright State University;	14
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(v) Youngstown State University.	15
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(b) Working towards obtaining an independent social worker	16
or social worker license under section 4757.26 of the Revised	17
Code.	18

(2) "Qualifying school" means any of the following public schools in which at least fifty per cent of the students are eligible for a free or reduced-price lunch and that agrees to employ an eligible student under the program:

(a) A school district;

(b) An educational service center;

(c) A community school established under Chapter 3314. of the Revised Code;

(d) A STEM school established under Chapter 3326. of the Revised Code.

(3) "Supervisor" means the assigned supervisor, field instructor, or task instructor that supervises an eligible student, as assigned by the eligible student's university.

(B) Not later than ninety days after the effective date of this section, the Chancellor of Higher Education shall establish the Social Work Apprenticeship Retention and Training (SMART) internship program to support students and families and to help address nonacademic barriers to student success. The chancellor shall establish the program as a three-year pilot program to test strategies for strengthening the school-based social work workforce in underserved and high-need schools. Beginning with the academic year that begins after the effective date of this section, the Chancellor shall award grants to eligible students to provide a paid and educationally meaningful internship experience at a qualifying school.

The pilot program shall be evaluative in nature and is not intended to establish a permanent program without further action by the General Assembly.

Nothing in this section shall be construed to require or
expand the provision of clinical mental health treatment in
schools.

(C) Eligible students shall apply to participate in the
pilot program in a form and manner prescribed by the Chancellor.

(D) Each eligible student awarded a grant under this
section shall work at an internship for up to twenty hours per
week for not more than thirty weeks.

(E) Each grant shall be awarded for three academic years
and shall not exceed fifteen thousand dollars for each school
year. The Chancellor shall distribute the grant through either
of the following methods:

(1) At a rate of twenty-five dollars per hour that is paid
on the same pay schedule offered to other licensed educators at
the qualifying school where the eligible student is working;

(2) Through a lump sum payment of up to fifteen thousand
dollars that shall be paid at the end of the internship period
for the corresponding school year.

(F) (1) If the grant program or a student's internship is
permanently terminated, and the student does not satisfy the
requirements of an eligible student under this section, the
following applies:

(a) For a student who receives a grant under division (E)
(1) of this section, no further grant payments shall be made to
that individual as of the day the student no longer meets the
requirements.

(b) For a student who receives a grant under division (E)
(2) of this section, the student may receive a prorated amount

of the lump sum that reflects the number of hours the student 75
worked during the student's internship at a qualifying school 76
while meeting the requirements of an eligible student. 77

(2) If a student temporarily does not satisfy the 78
requirements of an eligible student under this section, due to 79
relocating to another qualifying school or due to a leave of 80
absence, the following applies: 81

(a) For a student who receives a grant under division (E) 82
(1) of this section, no payments shall be made during the period 83
in which the student does not meet the requirements. Payments 84
shall resume once the student again meets the requirements of an 85
eligible student but shall not extend beyond thirty weeks from 86
the date the student began the internship. 87

(b) For a student who receives a grant under division (E) 88
(2) of this section, the student remains eligible to receive the 89
full grant amount if the student completes all of the 90
requirements of the program prescribed under this section. 91

(G) Each university at which an eligible student is 92
enrolled may continue implementing any existing evaluation 93
processes required as part of any certification, licensing, or 94
approval requirements associated with serving as a school-based 95
social worker or student support professional. 96

(H) Each eligible student that receives a grant under this 97
section shall submit any evaluations the student receives, 98
including evaluations under division (G) of this section, while 99
completing an internship at a qualifying school to the 100
Chancellor. The Chancellor shall use any evaluation received 101
under this section to determine an eligible student's continued 102
eligibility for a grant under this section and shall notify the 103

student if the Chancellor disqualifies a student for a grant 104
based on evaluations under this division. 105

(I) The Chancellor shall provide grants to supervisors of 106
up to two hundred fifty dollars for each eligible student the 107
individual supervises. 108

(J) The Chancellor shall adopt rules to administer the 109
pilot program. 110

(K) The Chancellor shall submit the following reports to 111
the standing committees of the House of Representatives and the 112
Senate that consider higher education legislation: 113

(1) An interim report following completion of the second 114
academic year of the pilot program's operation that focuses on 115
the following: 116

(a) Program participation; 117

(b) Internship placements; 118

(c) Early completion and retention trends; 119

(d) Implementation challenges; 120

(e) Recommended program adjustments. 121

(2) A final report upon the completion of the pilot 122
program that evaluates overall program effectiveness and 123
includes recommendations regarding the continuation, expansion, 124
modification, or future funding of the program. 125

(L) Any reporting required under this section shall be 126
limited to aggregate data only and to information that is 127
reasonably available through program administration, 128
participating universities, and qualifying schools. No new or 129
duplicate data collection shall be created to fulfill the 130

reporting requirements under this section. To the extent 131
practicable, each report should include all of the following: 132

(1) The number of students who applied to and participated 133
in the program, disaggregated by university; 134

(2) The number of students who successfully completed 135
internships; 136

(3) The number, type, and geographic distribution of 137
qualifying schools served; 138

(4) A high-level, aggregate comparison of where 139
participating students were enrolled versus the schools or 140
regions in which internships were completed; 141

(5) Early and post-program workforce placement outcomes, 142
to the extent available; 143

(6) General categories of nonacademic supports provided to 144
students and families; 145

(7) Supervisor participation and feedback; 146

(8) Workforce gaps addressed in underserved and high-need 147
schools; 148

(9) Recommendations for program improvement or 149
scalability. 150

The Chancellor may include any additional information 151
related to the pilot program the Chancellor determines is 152
necessary to provide context in either the interim or final 153
report. 154

(M) Based on the amount of the appropriation made for the 155
program established under this section and the number of 156
applications the Chancellor receives, after the first year of 157

the program, the Chancellor may award grants to a new cohort of 158
eligible students for subsequent years of the program or, 159
instead of awarding grants to a new cohort, continue to award 160
grants to eligible students who are currently participating in 161
the program, until the students complete their internships. 162

(N) The Chancellor shall cease awarding any new grants 163
under this section after the third academic year that occurs 164
after the effective date of this section. 165

Section 2. All items in this act are hereby appropriated 166
as designated out of any moneys in the state treasury to the 167
credit of the designated fund. For all operating appropriations 168
made in this act, those in the first column are for fiscal year 169
2027 and those in the second column are for fiscal year 2028. 170
The operating appropriations made in this act are in addition to 171
any other operating appropriations made for these fiscal years. 172

	The foregoing appropriation item 336519, Community				176

Projects, shall be used, in collaboration with the Department of 177
Higher Education, for the Social Work Apprenticeship Retention 178
and Training (SMART) Internship Pilot Program established in 179
Section 1 of this act. 180

Section 4. Within the limits set forth in this act, the 181
Director of Budget and Management shall establish accounts 182
indicating the source and amount of funds for each appropriation 183
made in this act, and shall determine the manner in which 184
appropriation accounts shall be maintained. 185

Expenditures from the FY 2027 operating appropriations 186
contained in this act shall be accounted for as though made in, 187
and are subject to all applicable provisions of, H.B. 96 of the 188
136th General Assembly. Expenditures from the FY 2028 operating 189
appropriations contained in this act shall be accounted for as 190
though made in, and are subject to all applicable provisions of, 191
the main operating appropriations act of the 137th General 192
Assembly. 193

Section 5. This act shall be known as the Ohio Students 194
and Families Workforce Strengthening Act. 195
