To amend sections 4506.07, 4506.11, 4507.06, 1
4507.13, 4507.51, and 4507.52 of the Revised 2
Code to require the Registrar to include an 3
identifying symbol on a driver's license, 4
commercial driver's license, or state 5
identification card for individuals with certain 6
disabilities, if requested. 7

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4506.07, 4506.11, 4507.06, 8
4507.13, 4507.51, and 4507.52 of the Revised Code be amended to 9
read as follows: 10

Sec. 4506.07. (A) An applicant for a commercial driver's 11
license, restricted commercial driver's license, or a commercial 12
driver's license temporary instruction permit, or a duplicate of 13
such a license or permit, shall submit an application upon a 14
form approved and furnished by the registrar of motor vehicles. 15
Except as provided in section 4506.24 of the Revised Code in 16
regard to a restricted commercial driver's license, the 17
applicant shall sign the application which shall contain the 18
following information: 19

(1) The applicant's name, date of birth, social security account number, sex, general description including height, weight, and color of hair and eyes, current residence, duration of residence in this state, state of domicile, country of citizenship, and occupation;

(2) Whether the applicant previously has been licensed to operate a commercial motor vehicle or any other type of motor vehicle in another state or a foreign jurisdiction and, if so, when, by what state, and whether the license or driving privileges currently are suspended or revoked in any jurisdiction, or the applicant otherwise has been disqualified from operating a commercial motor vehicle, or is subject to an out-of-service order issued under this chapter or any similar law of another state or a foreign jurisdiction and, if so, the date of, locations involved, and reason for the suspension, revocation, disqualification, or out-of-service order;

(3) Whether the applicant has any physical or mental disability or disease that prevents the applicant from exercising reasonable and ordinary control over a motor vehicle while operating it upon a highway or is or has been subject to any condition resulting in episodic impairment of consciousness or loss of muscular control and, if so, the nature and extent of the disability, disease, or condition, and the names and addresses of the physicians, certified nurse-midwives if authorized as described in section 4723.438 of the Revised Code, clinical nurse specialists, or certified nurse practitioners attending the applicant;

(4) Whether the applicant has obtained a medical examiner's certificate as required by this chapter and, beginning January 30, 2012, the applicant, prior to or at the

time of applying, has self-certified to the registrar the applicable status of the applicant under division (A) (1) of section 4506.10 of the Revised Code;

(5) Whether the applicant has pending a citation for violation of any motor vehicle law or ordinance except a parking violation and, if so, a description of the citation, the court having jurisdiction of the offense, and the date when the offense occurred;

(6) If an applicant has not certified the applicant's willingness to make an anatomical gift under section 2108.05 of the Revised Code, whether the applicant wishes to certify willingness to make such an anatomical gift, which shall be given no consideration in the issuance of a license;

(7) Whether the applicant has executed a valid durable power of attorney for health care pursuant to sections 1337.11 to 1337.17 of the Revised Code or has executed a declaration governing the use or continuation, or the withholding or withdrawal, of life-sustaining treatment pursuant to sections 2133.01 to 2133.15 of the Revised Code and, if the applicant has executed either type of instrument, whether the applicant wishes the license issued to indicate that the applicant has executed the instrument;

(8) Whether the applicant is a veteran, active duty, or reservist of the armed forces of the United States and, if the applicant is such, whether the applicant wishes the license issued to indicate that the applicant is a veteran, active duty, or reservist of the armed forces of the United States by a military designation on the license;

(9) Whether the applicant currently is prohibited by the

federal motor carrier safety administration from operating a 79
commercial motor vehicle because the applicant violated 49 80
C.F.R. 382, subpart B; 81

(10) Whether the applicant has a developmental disability, 82
a neurodevelopmental condition, a hearing impairment, or any 83
other medical alert and, if so, whether the applicant wishes the 84
license issued to indicate the disability, condition, 85
impairment, or alert by a symbol on the license. 86

(B) Every applicant shall certify, on a form approved and 87
furnished by the registrar, all of the following: 88

(1) That the motor vehicle in which the applicant intends 89
to take the driving skills test is representative of the type of 90
motor vehicle that the applicant expects to operate as a driver; 91

(2) That the applicant is not subject to any 92
disqualification or out-of-service order, or license suspension, 93
revocation, or cancellation, under the laws of this state, of 94
another state, or of a foreign jurisdiction and does not have 95
more than one driver's license issued by this or another state 96
or a foreign jurisdiction; 97

(3) Any additional information, certification, or evidence 98
that the registrar requires by rule in order to ensure that the 99
issuance of a commercial driver's license or commercial driver's 100
license temporary instruction permit to the applicant is in 101
compliance with the law of this state and with federal law. 102

(C) Every applicant shall execute a form, approved and 103
furnished by the registrar, under which the applicant consents 104
to the release by the registrar of information from the 105
applicant's driving record. 106

(D) The registrar or a deputy registrar, in accordance 107

with section 3503.11 of the Revised Code, shall register as an 108
elector any applicant for a commercial driver's license or for a 109
renewal or duplicate of such a license under this chapter, if 110
the applicant is eligible and wishes to be registered as an 111
elector. The decision of an applicant whether to register as an 112
elector shall be given no consideration in the decision of 113
whether to issue the applicant a license or a renewal or 114
duplicate. 115

(E) The registrar or a deputy registrar, in accordance 116
with section 3503.11 of the Revised Code, shall offer the 117
opportunity of completing a notice of change of residence or 118
change of name to any applicant for a commercial driver's 119
license or for a renewal or duplicate of such a license who is a 120
resident of this state, if the applicant is a registered elector 121
who has changed the applicant's residence or name and has not 122
filed such a notice. 123

(F) In considering any application submitted pursuant to 124
this section, the bureau of motor vehicles may conduct any 125
inquiries necessary to ensure that issuance or renewal of a 126
commercial driver's license would not violate any provision of 127
the Revised Code or federal law. 128

(G) In addition to any other information it contains, the 129
form approved and furnished by the registrar of motor vehicles 130
for an application for a commercial driver's license, restricted 131
commercial driver's license, or a commercial driver's license 132
temporary instruction permit or an application for a duplicate 133
of such a license or permit shall inform applicants that the 134
applicant must present a copy of the applicant's DD-214 or an 135
equivalent document in order to qualify to have the license, or 136
permit, or duplicate indicate that the applicant is a veteran, 137

active duty, or reservist of the armed forces of the United 138
States based on a request made pursuant to division (A) (8) of 139
this section. 140

Sec. 4506.11. (A) Every commercial driver's license shall 141
be marked "commercial driver's license" or "CDL" and shall be of 142
such material and so designed as to prevent its reproduction or 143
alteration without ready detection. The commercial driver's 144
license for licensees under twenty-one years of age shall have 145
characteristics prescribed by the registrar of motor vehicles 146
distinguishing it from that issued to a licensee who is twenty- 147
one years of age or older. Every commercial driver's license 148
shall display all of the following information: 149

(1) The name and residence address of the licensee; 150

(2) A photograph of the licensee showing the licensee's 151
uncovered face; 152

(3) A physical description of the licensee, including sex, 153
height, weight, and color of eyes and hair; 154

(4) The licensee's date of birth; 155

(5) The licensee's social security number if the person 156
has requested that the number be displayed in accordance with 157
section 4501.31 of the Revised Code or if federal law requires 158
the social security number to be displayed and any number or 159
other identifier the director of public safety considers 160
appropriate and establishes by rules adopted under Chapter 119. 161
of the Revised Code and in compliance with federal law; 162

(6) The licensee's signature; 163

(7) The classes of commercial motor vehicles the licensee 164
is authorized to drive and any endorsements or restrictions 165

relating to the licensee's driving of those vehicles;	166
(8) The name of this state;	167
(9) The dates of issuance and of expiration of the license;	168 169
(10) If the licensee has certified willingness to make an anatomical gift under section 2108.05 of the Revised Code, any symbol chosen by the registrar of motor vehicles to indicate that the licensee has certified that willingness;	170 171 172 173
(11) If the licensee has executed a durable power of attorney for health care or a declaration governing the use or continuation, or the withholding or withdrawal, of life- sustaining treatment and has specified that the licensee wishes the license to indicate that the licensee has executed either type of instrument, any symbol chosen by the registrar to indicate that the licensee has executed either type of instrument;	174 175 176 177 178 179 180 181

any supporting documentation required by the registrar, any 195
symbol chosen by the registrar to indicate the disability, 196
condition, impairment, or alert; 197

(15) Any other information the registrar considers 198
advisable and requires by rule. 199

(B) The registrar may establish and maintain a file of 200
negatives of photographs taken for the purposes of this section. 201

(C) Neither the registrar nor any deputy registrar shall 202
issue a commercial driver's license to anyone under twenty-one 203
years of age that does not have the characteristics prescribed 204
by the registrar distinguishing it from the commercial driver's 205
license issued to persons who are twenty-one years of age or 206
older. 207

(D) Whoever violates division (C) of this section is 208
guilty of a minor misdemeanor. 209

Sec. 4507.06. (A) (1) Every application for a driver's 210
license, motorcycle operator's license or endorsement, or motor- 211
driven cycle or motor scooter license or endorsement, or 212
duplicate of any such license or endorsement, shall be made upon 213
the approved form furnished by the registrar of motor vehicles 214
and shall be signed by the applicant. 215

Every application shall state the following: 216

(a) The applicant's name, date of birth, social security 217
number if such has been assigned, sex, general description, 218
including height, weight, color of hair, and eyes, residence 219
address, including county of residence, duration of residence in 220
this state, and country of citizenship; 221

(b) Whether the applicant previously has been licensed as 222

an operator, chauffeur, driver, commercial driver, or motorcycle operator and, if so, when, by what state, and whether such license is suspended or canceled at the present time and, if so, the date of and reason for the suspension or cancellation;

(c) Whether the applicant is now or ever has been afflicted with epilepsy, or whether the applicant now has any physical or mental disability or disease and, if so, the nature and extent of the disability or disease, giving the names and addresses of physicians, certified nurse-midwives if authorized as described in section 4723.438 of the Revised Code, clinical nurse specialists, or certified nurse practitioners then or previously in attendance upon the applicant;

(d) Whether an applicant for a duplicate driver's license, duplicate license containing a motorcycle operator endorsement, or duplicate license containing a motor-driven cycle or motor scooter endorsement has pending a citation for violation of any motor vehicle law or ordinance, a description of any such citation pending, and the date of the citation;

(e) If an applicant has not certified the applicant's willingness to make an anatomical gift under section 2108.05 of the Revised Code, whether the applicant wishes to certify willingness to make such an anatomical gift, which shall be given no consideration in the issuance of a license or endorsement;

(f) Whether the applicant has executed a valid durable power of attorney for health care pursuant to sections 1337.11 to 1337.17 of the Revised Code or has executed a declaration governing the use or continuation, or the withholding or withdrawal, of life-sustaining treatment pursuant to sections 2133.01 to 2133.15 of the Revised Code and, if the applicant has

executed either type of instrument, whether the applicant wishes 253
the applicant's license to indicate that the applicant has 254
executed the instrument; 255

(g) Whether the applicant is a veteran, active duty, or 256
reservist of the armed forces of the United States and, if the 257
applicant is such, whether the applicant wishes the applicant's 258
license to indicate that the applicant is a veteran, active 259
duty, or reservist of the armed forces of the United States by a 260
military designation on the license; 261

(h) Whether the applicant has a developmental disability, 262
a neurodevelopmental condition, a hearing impairment, or any 263
other medical alert and, if so, whether the applicant wishes the 264
license issued to indicate the disability, condition, 265
impairment, or alert by a symbol on the license. 266

(2) Every applicant for a driver's license applying in 267
person at a deputy registrar office shall be photographed at the 268
time the application for the license is made. The application 269
shall state any additional information that the registrar 270
requires. 271

(B) The registrar or a deputy registrar, in accordance 272
with section 3503.11 of the Revised Code, shall register as an 273
elector any person who applies for a license or endorsement 274
under division (A) of this section, or for a renewal or 275
duplicate of the license or endorsement, if the applicant is 276
eligible and wishes to be registered as an elector. The decision 277
of an applicant whether to register as an elector shall be given 278
no consideration in the decision of whether to issue the 279
applicant a license or endorsement, or a renewal or duplicate. 280

(C) The registrar or a deputy registrar, in accordance 281

with section 3503.11 of the Revised Code, shall offer the 282
opportunity of completing a notice of change of residence or 283
change of name to any applicant for a driver's license or 284
endorsement under division (A) of this section, or for a renewal 285
or duplicate of the license or endorsement, if the applicant is 286
a registered elector who has changed the applicant's residence 287
or name and has not filed such a notice. 288

(D) In addition to any other information it contains, the 289
approved form furnished by the registrar of motor vehicles for 290
an application for a license or endorsement or an application 291
for a duplicate of any such license or endorsement shall inform 292
applicants that the applicant must present a copy of the 293
applicant's DD-214 or an equivalent document in order to qualify 294
to have the license or duplicate indicate that the applicant is 295
a veteran, active duty, or reservist of the armed forces of the 296
United States based on a request made pursuant to division (A) 297
(1)(g) of this section. 298

Sec. 4507.13. (A) (1) The registrar of motor vehicles shall 299
issue a driver's license to every person licensed as an operator 300
of motor vehicles other than commercial motor vehicles. No 301
person licensed as a commercial motor vehicle driver under 302
Chapter 4506. of the Revised Code need procure a driver's 303
license, but no person shall drive any commercial motor vehicle 304
unless licensed as a commercial motor vehicle driver. 305

(2) Every driver's license shall display all of the 306
following information: 307

(a) The distinguishing number assigned to the licensee; 308

(b) The licensee's name and date of birth; 309

(c) The licensee's residence address and county of 310

residence;	311
(d) A photograph of the licensee;	312
(e) A brief description of the licensee for the purpose of identification;	313 314
(f) A facsimile of the signature of the licensee as it appears on the application for the license;	315 316
(g) A notation, in a manner prescribed by the registrar, indicating any condition described in division (D) (3) of section 4507.08 of the Revised Code to which the licensee is subject;	317 318 319
(h) If the licensee has executed a durable power of attorney for health care or a declaration governing the use or continuation, or the withholding or withdrawal, of life- sustaining treatment and has specified that the licensee wishes the license to indicate that the licensee has executed either type of instrument, any symbol chosen by the registrar to indicate that the licensee has executed either type of instrument;	320 321 322 323 324 325 326 327

(j) If the licensee is a noncitizen of the United States, a notation designating that the licensee is a noncitizen;	335 336

disability, a neurodevelopmental condition, a hearing 339
impairment, or any other medical alert and has presented any 340
supporting documentation required by the registrar, any symbol 341
chosen by the registrar to indicate the disability, condition, 342
impairment, or alert; 343

(1) Any additional information that the registrar requires 344
by rule. 345

(3) No license shall display the licensee's social 346
security number unless the licensee specifically requests that 347
the licensee's social security number be displayed on the 348
license. If federal law requires the licensee's social security 349
number to be displayed on the license, the social security 350
number shall be displayed on the license notwithstanding this 351
section. 352

(4) The driver's license for licensees under twenty-one 353
years of age shall have characteristics prescribed by the 354
registrar distinguishing it from that issued to a licensee who 355
is twenty-one years of age or older, except that a driver's 356
license issued to a person who applies no more than thirty days 357
before the applicant's twenty-first birthday shall have the 358
characteristics of a license issued to a person who is twenty- 359
one years of age or older. 360

(5) The limited term license issued to a temporary 361
resident shall contain the words "limited term" and shall have 362
any additional characteristics prescribed by the registrar 363
distinguishing it from a license issued to a resident. 364

(6) Every driver's or commercial driver's license 365
displaying a motorcycle operator's endorsement and every 366
restricted license to operate a motor vehicle also shall display 367

the designation "novice," if the endorsement or license is 368
issued to a person who is eighteen years of age or older and 369
previously has not been licensed to operate a motorcycle by this 370
state or another jurisdiction recognized by this state. The 371
"novice" designation shall be effective for one year after the 372
date of issuance of the motorcycle operator's endorsement or 373
license. 374

(7) Each license issued under this section shall be of 375
such material and so designed as to prevent its reproduction or 376
alteration without ready detection. 377

(B) Except in regard to a driver's license issued to a 378
person who applies no more than thirty days before the 379
applicant's twenty-first birthday, neither the registrar nor any 380
deputy registrar shall issue a driver's license to anyone under 381
twenty-one years of age that does not have the characteristics 382
prescribed by the registrar distinguishing it from the driver's 383
license issued to persons who are twenty-one years of age or 384
older. 385

(C) The registrar shall ensure that driver's licenses 386
issued in accordance with the federal "Real ID Act," 49 U.S.C. 387
30301, et seq., comply with the regulations specified in 6 388
C.F.R. part 37. 389

(D) Whoever violates division (B) of this section is 390
guilty of a minor misdemeanor. 391

Sec. 4507.51. (A) (1) Every application for an 392
identification card or duplicate shall be made on an approved 393
form furnished by the registrar of motor vehicles and shall be 394
signed by the applicant. The application also shall be signed by 395
the applicant's parent or guardian, or by the department of 396

rehabilitation and correction or the department of youth 397
services, as applicable, if the applicant is under eighteen 398
years of age. 399

Every application shall contain the following information: 400

(a) The applicant's name, date of birth, sex, general 401
description including the applicant's height, weight, hair 402
color, and eye color, address, country of citizenship, and 403
social security number. 404

(b) If an applicant has not already certified the 405
applicant's willingness to make an anatomical gift under section 406
2108.05 of the Revised Code, whether the applicant wishes to 407
certify willingness to make such an anatomical gift and 408
information about the requirements of sections 2108.01 to 409
2108.29 of the Revised Code that apply to persons who are less 410
than eighteen years of age. The statement regarding willingness 411
to make such a donation shall be given no consideration in the 412
decision of whether to issue an identification card. 413

(c) Whether the applicant has executed a valid durable 414
power of attorney for health care pursuant to sections 1337.11 415
to 1337.17 of the Revised Code or has executed a declaration 416
governing the use or continuation, or the withholding or 417
withdrawal, of life-sustaining treatment pursuant to sections 418
2133.01 to 2133.15 of the Revised Code and, if the applicant has 419
executed either type of instrument, whether the applicant wishes 420
the identification card issued to indicate that the applicant 421
has executed the instrument. 422

(d) Whether the applicant is a veteran, active duty, or 423
reservist of the armed forces of the United States and, if the 424
applicant is such, whether the applicant wishes the 425

identification card issued to indicate that the applicant is a 426
veteran, active duty, or reservist of the armed forces of the 427
United States by a military designation on the identification 428
card. 429

(e) Whether the applicant has a developmental disability, 430
a neurodevelopmental condition, a hearing impairment, or any 431
other medical alert and, if so, whether the applicant wishes the 432
identification card issued to indicate the disability, 433
condition, impairment, or alert by a symbol on the 434
identification card. 435

(2) Each applicant applying in person at a deputy 436
registrar office shall be photographed at the time of making an 437
application. 438

(3) The registrar or deputy registrar, in accordance with 439
section 3503.11 of the Revised Code, shall register as an 440
elector any person who applies for an identification card or 441
duplicate if the applicant is eligible and wishes to be 442
registered as an elector. The decision of an applicant whether 443
to register as an elector shall be given no consideration in the 444
decision of whether to issue the applicant an identification 445
card or duplicate. 446

(4) The application shall be accompanied by any necessary 447
documents, as required by the registrar. The registrar or the 448
deputy registrar may authenticate the submitted documents and 449
verify the information in the application. 450

(B) (1) Except as provided in division (B) (2) of this 451
section or section 4507.061 of the Revised Code, the application 452
for an identification card or duplicate shall be filed in the 453
office of the registrar or deputy registrar. Each applicant 454

shall present documentary evidence as required by the registrar 455
of the applicant's age and identity, and the applicant shall 456
swear that all information given is true. 457

All applications for an identification card or duplicate 458
under this section shall be filed in duplicate, and if submitted 459
to a deputy registrar, a copy shall be forwarded to the 460
registrar. The registrar shall prescribe rules for the manner in 461
which a deputy registrar is to file and maintain applications 462
and other records. The registrar shall maintain a suitable, 463
indexed record of all applications denied and cards issued or 464
canceled. 465

(2) The application for an identification card filed by 466
either the department of rehabilitation and correction or the 467
department of youth services on behalf of an individual in 468
prison or in the department's custody shall be submitted through 469
the process established by the registrar. The registrar shall 470
establish the process for submission of such applications and 471
the process for mailing the identification card to either the 472
individual or the applicable department. 473

(C) In addition to any other information it contains, the 474
form furnished by the registrar of motor vehicles for an 475
application for an identification card or duplicate shall inform 476
applicants that the applicant must present a copy of the 477
applicant's DD-214 or an equivalent document in order to qualify 478
to have the card or duplicate indicate that the applicant is an 479
honorably discharged veteran of the armed forces of the United 480
States based on a request made pursuant to division (A) (2) (b) of 481
this section. 482

Sec. 4507.52. (A) (1) Each identification card issued by 483
the registrar of motor vehicles or a deputy registrar shall 484

display a distinguishing number assigned to the cardholder, and 485
shall display the following inscription: 486

"STATE OF OHIO IDENTIFICATION CARD 487

This card is not valid for the purpose of operating a 488
motor vehicle. It is provided solely for the purpose of 489
establishing the identity of the bearer described on the card." 490

(2) The identification card shall display substantially 491
the same information as contained in the application and as 492
described in division (A) (1) of section 4507.51 of the Revised 493
Code, including, if the cardholder is a noncitizen of the United 494
States, a notation designating that the cardholder is a 495
noncitizen. The identification card shall not display the 496
cardholder's social security number unless the cardholder 497
specifically requests that the cardholder's social security 498
number be displayed on the card. If federal law requires the 499
cardholder's social security number to be displayed on the 500
identification card, the social security number shall be 501
displayed on the card notwithstanding this section. 502

(3) The identification card also shall display the 503
photograph of the cardholder. 504

(4) If the cardholder has executed a durable power of 505
attorney for health care or a declaration governing the use or 506
continuation, or the withholding or withdrawal, of life- 507
sustaining treatment and has specified that the cardholder 508
wishes the identification card to indicate that the cardholder 509
has executed either type of instrument, the card also shall 510
display any symbol chosen by the registrar to indicate that the 511
cardholder has executed either type of instrument. 512

(5) If the cardholder has specified that the cardholder 513

wishes the identification card to indicate that the cardholder 514
is a veteran, active duty, or reservist of the armed forces of 515
the United States and has presented a copy of the cardholder's 516
DD-214 form or an equivalent document, the card also shall 517
display any symbol chosen by the registrar to indicate that the 518
cardholder is a veteran, active duty, or reservist of the armed 519
forces of the United States. 520

(6) The card shall be designed as to prevent its 521
reproduction or alteration without ready detection. 522

(7) The identification card for persons under twenty-one 523
years of age shall have characteristics prescribed by the 524
registrar distinguishing it from that issued to a person who is 525
twenty-one years of age or older, except that an identification 526
card issued to a person who applies no more than thirty days 527
before the applicant's twenty-first birthday shall have the 528
characteristics of an identification card issued to a person who 529
is twenty-one years of age or older. 530

(8) Every identification card issued to a resident of this 531
state shall display the expiration date of the card, in 532
accordance with section 4507.501 of the Revised Code. 533

(9) Every identification card issued to a temporary 534
resident shall expire in accordance with section 4507.501 of the 535

term. Every limited term identification card and limited term 537
temporary identification card shall contain the words "limited 538
term" and shall have any additional characteristics prescribed 539
by the registrar distinguishing it from an identification card 540
issued to a resident. 541

(10) If the cardholder has specified that the cardholder 542

wishes the identification card to indicate that the cardholder 543
has a developmental disability, a neurodevelopmental condition, 544
a hearing impairment, or any other medical alert and has 545
presented any supporting documentation required by the 546
registrar, the card also shall display any symbol chosen by the 547
registrar to indicate the disability, condition, impairment, or 548
alert. 549

(B) (1) If a card is lost, destroyed, or mutilated, the 550
person to whom the card was issued may obtain a duplicate by 551
doing both of the following: 552

(a) Furnishing suitable proof of the loss, destruction, or 553
mutilation to the registrar or a deputy registrar; 554

(b) Filing an application and presenting documentary 555
evidence under section 4507.51 of the Revised Code. 556

(2) A cardholder may apply to obtain a reprint of the 557
cardholder's identification card through electronic means in 558
accordance with section 4507.40 of the Revised Code. 559

(3) A cardholder may obtain a replacement identification 560
card that reflects any change of the cardholder's name by 561
furnishing suitable proof of the change to the registrar or a 562
deputy registrar. 563

(4) Except as provided in division (B) (5) or (6) of this 564
section, when a cardholder applies for a duplicate, reprint, or 565
replacement identification card, the cardholder shall pay the 566
following fees: 567

(a) Two dollars and fifty cents; 568

(b) A deputy registrar or service fee equal to the amount 569
established under section 4503.038 of the Revised Code. 570

(5) The following cardholders may apply for a duplicate,	571
reprint, or replacement identification card without payment of	572
any fee prescribed in division (B) (4) of this section:	573
(a) A disabled veteran who has a service-connected	574
disability rated at one hundred per cent by the veterans'	575
administration;	576
(b) A resident who is permanently or irreversibly	577
disabled;	578
(c) A resident who is in the custody of the department of	579
rehabilitation and correction or the department of youth	580
services.	581
(6) A cardholder who is seventeen years of age or older	582
may apply for a replacement identification card without payment	583
of any fee prescribed in division (B) (4) of this section.	584
(7) A duplicate, reprint, or replacement identification	585
card expires on the same date as the card it replaces.	586
(C) The registrar shall cancel any card upon determining	587
that the card was obtained unlawfully, issued in error, or was	588
altered.	589
(D) (1) No agent of the state or its political subdivisions	590
shall condition the granting of any benefit, service, right, or	591
privilege upon the possession by any person of an identification	592
card. Nothing in this section shall preclude any publicly	593
operated or franchised transit system from using an	594
identification card for the purpose of granting benefits or	595
services of the system.	596
(2) No person shall be required to apply for, carry, or	597
possess an identification card.	598

(E) Except in regard to an identification card issued to a 599
person who applies no more than thirty days before the 600
applicant's twenty-first birthday, neither the registrar nor any 601
deputy registrar shall issue an identification card to a person 602
under twenty-one years of age that does not have the 603
characteristics prescribed by the registrar distinguishing it 604
from the identification card issued to persons who are twenty- 605
one years of age or older. 606

(F) The registrar shall ensure that identification cards 607
issued in accordance with the federal "Real ID Act," 49 U.S.C. 608
30301, et seq., comply with the regulations specified in 6 609
C.F.R. part 37. 610

(G) Whoever violates division (E) of this section is 611
guilty of a minor misdemeanor. 612

Section 2. That existing sections 4506.07, 4506.11, 613
4507.06, 4507.13, 4507.51, and 4507.52 of the Revised Code are 614
